action was started to pay \$2 per month for all the time since the building was erected. This offer as well, had been rejected by the Council. At the trial it was demonstrated beyond dispute that all the water used in the building if charged for at the rates fixed by the ordinance would never have exceeded the amounts paid by Mr. and Mrs. Stipe. Several disinterested witnesses, who had been around the garage and residence for years, conclusively established that no water had been wasted or needlessly used at any place in the buildings or at any time.

I realize of course that this letter may be discounted as coming from an attorney interested in the case. However, if anyone questions the decision of the Grand Jury which heard the charges, or the verdict of the trial jury which decided the case last week, an examination of the facts will

convince the most skeptical. Certainly Mr. and Mrs. Stipe by their several offers to submit the whole controversy to any disinterested persons have indicated that they had no reason to fear a most thorough investigation.
