Oregon Butter Wins in Middle West

Oregon butter, shown in competition with 400 samples from more than a dozen states, won third place in the National Creamery Buttermakers association contest at St. Paul this week. The prize winning Oregon butter was made by Halger P. C. Nielsen at the college creamery at Corvallis and received a score of 95. The two samples which placed higher were both from Minnesota and exceeded the Oregon buttermakers' score by only a half point and a quarter point. Nine Oregon butter makers sent samples to this national contest and all scored far above the competitive average.

Eugene, Ore., June 30—For the first time this year women students of the University of Oregon crowded out men for first place in grade standings for living organizations. Hendricks Hall, girls' dormitory, lead during the term just ended by a slight margin, Sigma Hall, men's unit, which was in first place for fall and winter terms.

New Drivers License Must be Renewed by Sept.

Three hundred thousand Oregon motorists must obtain renewal drivers' licenses before September 1, the first day on which the law requires every motor vehicle operator to have a new-type permit, according to Earl E. Hoss, secretary of state.

Authority has been given by the legislature to waive examination of renewal applications, except for those 70 years of age and older, or when, because of obvious physical impairments or a questionable driving record there is reason to believe that an applicant may not be qualified to operate a car in a safe manner. Holders of new-type drivers' licenses and renewals issued since July 1, 1931, need not renew their permits until June 30, 1935, regardless of the expiration date they bear.

In order to obtain a renewal permit Mr. Hoss warned, it will not be sufficient merely to mail a dollar. The applicants must obtain a regulation application form either by mail from the secretary or state's office in Salem, or from state police, county sheriffs, or examiners. This must be filled out and signed before a notary public or one of the official examiners, all of whom have notaries' commissions, or other persons qualified to administer oaths. State examiners will affix the notary seal free of charge.

An examiner may be located by referring to the printed schedules which may be secured from the secretary of state's office, state police or sheriffs.

Home Seed Supply Started

PRINEVILLE—Because of the constantly increasing demand for beardless barley for hay, most of the Cook county crop is harvested for that purpose, and it has been necessary each year to import seed. This year, however, H. W. Flowers and Vernon Eldridge of the Ohoco project have agreed to cooperate with County Agent W. B. Tucker in starting a home supply by harvesting seed instead of hay.

and give these reasons why the proposed tax should be killed

§ A sales tax increases the consumer's cost of living.

§ This proposed Sales Tax does not rest fairly upon consumers in proportion their ability to pay. It bears heaviest upon those who have little to spend, and their pittance is cut down by the increased cost of the things they are compelled to buy.

§ A Sales Tax increases the retailer's cost of doing business—and makes him a tax collector for the state.

§ A Sales Tax will penalize the honest merchant, because the creation of a highly expensive organization to check the accounts of retailers throughout the state is impossible, thus influencing irresponsible retailers to falsify reports and evade the tax.

§ A Sales Tax will influence the consumer to buy outside of the state. The Sales Tax is based on sales, regardless of profit. A merchant operating at a loss would be taxed on gross sales, and just as heavily as if he were making big profits.

§ This proposed Sales Tax does not distinguish between necessities and luxuries. Foods are taxed the same as other merchandise.

§ The Sales Tax would force higher retail prices, curtail buying and reduce employment.

§ Present real estate taxes could not be reduced over one-fifteenth by this plan, and the thousands of dollars now assessed on personal property would be free of taxation.

§ The Sales Tax is just another tax, and will have a tendency to promote further governmental extravagance.
