guments, which carry with them no substitute for the property tax, and no remedy for admittedly distressing conditions in a majority of counties.

The voters will then realize that unless immediate action is taken to replace the breakdown in the property tax system by dependable revenues, a large number of rural schools will remain closed this fall; that blanket bankruptcy is imminent in many county governments; that the load attempted to be carried by warrants has broken the effectiveness of government, and that a start must be made toward relief.

The voters must conclude, and express by their votes, that they will not stand idly by, listening to petty squabbling and wrangling over the effect of provisions of the law, allowing Oregon taxpayers to be damaged and humiliated by failure to adopt a substitute for the state property tax, but will inform themselves from reliable sources, and vote right in this serious emergency.

### SPECIAL TOWN ELECTION

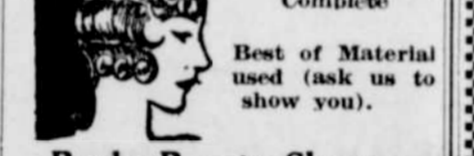
