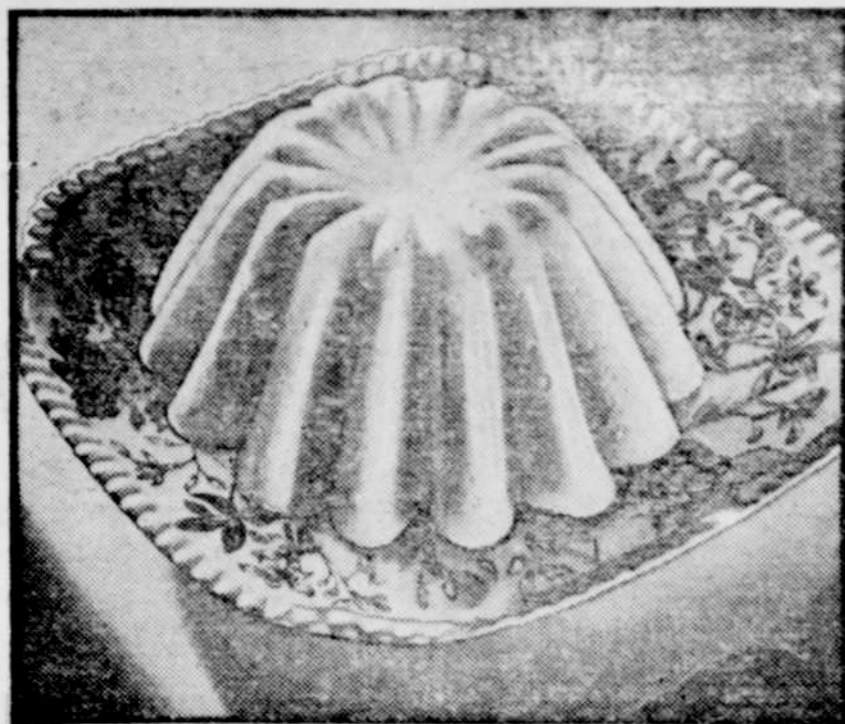


Light - but Satisfying



**L**ight but satisfying food . . . that is the secret of successful summer cooking. But it must also be food flavored with a touch of imagination to tempt languid summer appetites.

The touch of cool, piquant peppermint flavor in this tapioca cream is no less than a culinary inspiration. The orange moss with its orange-ivory color and its fresh fruit tang rejoices the eye as well as the palate. Peach bavarian cream is another dessert ace, too. Serve one of them some very warm day and watch the family take a renewed interest in food.

Peppermint Cream

1/2 cup quick-cooking tapioca  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
4 cups milk  
2/3 cup peppermint candy, crushed  
1 egg yolk, slightly beaten  
1 egg white, stiffly beaten  
Add quick-cooking tapioca and salt to milk, and cook in double boiler 15 minutes, or until tapioca is clear, stirring frequently. Add peppermint candy. Pour small amount of tapioca mixture over egg yolk, stirring vigorously. Return to double boiler and cook until thickened. Remove from fire. Fold a small amount into egg white. Add to remaining tapioca mixture and blend. Chill. Serve in sherbet glasses with chocolate sauce. Serves 8.

Peach Bavarian Cream

1 package lemon-flavored or orange-flavored gelatin  
1 cup warm water  
1 cup peach juice  
1/2 cup heavy cream  
1 cup crushed peaches, sweetened and drained  
2 or 3 drops almond extract  
Dissolve lemon-flavored or orange-flavored gelatin in warm water. Add sugar, orange juice, and almond. Chill until cold and syrupy. Fold in cream, whipped only until thick and shiny, but not stiff. Fold in peaches and flavoring. Chill until slightly thickened. Turn into individual molds. Chill until firm. Unmold. Garnish with peach slices. Serves 8.

Orange Moss

1 package lemon-flavored gelatin  
1 pint warm water  
4 tablespoons sugar  
1/2 cup orange juice  
Grated rind of 1 orange  
1 cup heavy cream  
Dissolve lemon-flavored gelatin in warm water. Add sugar, orange juice, and rind. Chill until cold and syrupy. Fold in cream, whipped only until thick and shiny, but not stiff. Chill until slightly thickened. Turn into mold. Chill until firm. Unmold. Serves 8.

FOURTH IRRIGATION TOUR SET FOR AUGUST 29-30

Dates for the fourth annual Willamette valley irrigation tour have just been announced as August 29 and 30, by the Oregon State college extension service, which has sponsored this trip of inspection the last few years.

The two-day tour this year will be confined to the northern part of the valley, probably not extending south of Corvallis. Some new territory to be covered will be irrigation systems in Multnomah and Clackamas counties. Places to be visited this year will include farms where practically the entire cultivated acreage is irrigated, says Art King, extension soils specialist who arranges the tour. In the early days of irrigation usually only a single field on a place would be watered, but now there are a growing number of fully irrigated farms, he reports.

Heavy storage of butter the past few months have depressed the market to the producer at least three cents a pound, or a reduction of 13% over last year. Varieties of Dogwood

The commonest variety of dogwood in America is the Cornus florida, generally regarded as one of the most beautiful of flowering trees. The white form has a distinctive light yellow-green flower center with four surrounding bracts, one to three inches long. The rose-red form is identical except for the color tint. Altogether there are about eighty species distributed over the temperate zone. Several representatives of the family are found in Mexico and in Peru. In Europe the Cornus sanguinea, with deep red autumn foliage, was a favorite source of arrow shafts in the Middle Ages. Even in our time it is wanted for its firm, hard wood, used in intricate inlay work.
