MAIN DISHES FOUNDED ON CHEESE

There comes a day in most families when the food budget suffers because of some unexpected expenditure in one of the other household departments. To the housewife this means living just a bit more economically. And to those who have a sound foundation in nutrition, some short cuts in the meal planning will mean a saving. In this "new deal", cheese plays an important part as a basis for inexpensive, but exceedingly tasty main dishes.

Cheese is a concentrated source of the solids found in milk and is therefore, high in protein, minerals, energy and vitamin value. Because of these dietetic values, cheese greatly augments the food value of the vegetable dishes. Some recipes containing vegetables and cheese are

Baked Corn and Cheese

- 2 tablespoons of butter
- 1 tablespoon of minced onion
- 2 tablespoons of minced green pepper

- 2 tablespoons of flour
- 1 1/2 cups of milk
- 1 1/2 cup of corn
- 1 cup of diced cheese
- 1/2 teaspoon of salt
- 1/4 teaspoon of paprika
- 2 Eggs
- 1 tablespoon of grated cheese.

Melt butter and cook onion and pepper in it for three minutes. Add flour, and when blended add milk; stir until mixture thickens. Add corn, diced cheese, seasonings and beaten egg yolks. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites, turn into a large baking dish, or into 6 small dishes, sprinkle grated cheese over top and bake in a moderate oven, 350 F 30 to 35 minutes for large dish, or 15 to 20 minutes in small dishes.

Carrot Ring

- 2 cups of cooked shredded carrots
- 1 1/2 cups of grated American cheese.
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup of bread crumbs
- Salt and pepper.

Thoroughly drain the cooked, shredded carrots, add grated cheese, beaten eggs, milk, crumbs, and seasonings to taste. Pour into a well-buttered ring mold. Bake in a pan of hot water, in a moderate oven, about one hour, or until firm. Unmold at once and serve hot.

Oregon Fruits to Meet all Tests

Oregon apples and pears will go to world markets this year cleaned better than ever before and fully meeting the new federal requirements of an extremely low tolerance for lead as well as other spray residues, says R. H. Robinson, agricultural chemist in the Oregon State college experiment station.

As soon as it was learned early this year that the new regulations would be in effect this season, Robinson and other station scientists set to work in cooperation with growers, shipping interests and cleaning machinery manufacturers to see what extra precautions, if any, would need to be taken by Oregon growers this year to make sure that fruit from this state would receive the federal O. K.

The result is the perfecting of washing procedure which is already in effect in the principal fruit sections and which has been recorded in permanent form in a new bulletin entitled "The Removal of Lead and Arsenic Spray Residue from Apples and Pears," by Robinson and his assistant M. B. Hatch.

"Under most Oregon conditions we found that the usual hydrochloric acid wash as developed by the Oregon station some years ago is adequate to remove both kinds of residue when the fruit is washed promptly and with slightly heated solution when necessary," says Robinson.

"Pest growers have experienced little or no difficulty this season. "Complications in cleaning arise mostly through the use of oil sprays late in the season and through accumulations of wax on the fruit because of its being allowed to remain long on the trees or to stand long after picking before washing. For that reason growers were advised not to apply oil sprays after July 7. Tests this year will show the latest date possible for use of oil sprays.

A double washing process using both acid and alkali and employing tandem machines was worked out this summer by the chemists and enough equipment has been installed in the principal centers to handle any of the fruit that proves unusually difficult to clean. The new bulletin, which is free to Oregon residents, gives detailed results of the experiments conducted this year.
