SPEAKING OF FLAVOR

Sometimes a meal may be well-balanced, colorful and still be uninteresting as far as flavor is concerned. Such meals often need an element of surprise in flavor. In other words, appetites and other senses of taste demand a pleasing jolt occasionally.

There is nothing quite like the snappy flavor of ginger to lend a note of interest to a meal. Ginger combines with molasses in many interesting ways and since molasses is a rich and inexpensive source of iron it is well to use it frequently. Ginger and molasses together call for sour milk. Sour milk, like sweet milk, is a wholesome and nutritious food and used in baking, it results in tastier, lighter and more tender products.

Some suggestions for adding flavor to meals are:

Sour Milk Gingerbread

- 1 cup dark molasses
- 1 cup sour milk
- 2 1-3 cups flour
- 1/4 cup melted butter
- 1 tsp soda
- 2 tsp ginger
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2 tsp baking powder

Mix soda with sour milk and add to molasses. Sift together remaining dry ingredients, combine mixtures, add butter, and beat vigorously. Pour into a buttered shallow pan, and bake thirty minutes in a moderate oven. Serve with cinnamon pears made as follows:

Cinnamon Pears

To the juice from one quart can of halves of pears, add 3/4 cup of sugar and 1/2 cup of red cinnamon candy. Boil for three minutes. Add pears and heat. Serve hot on warm gingerbread.

Pumpkin Pie

- 2 cups pumpkin
- 2 cups milk
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 tbs melted butter
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp ginger

- 1 tsp salt
- Pastry
- 1 1/2 cups whipped cream
- 1/2 cup grated American Cheese

Mix pumpkin, milk, eggs, butter, and seasonings. Beat 2 minutes. Line large muffin tins with pastry and fill with pumpkin mixture. Bake in a moderate oven 45 minutes. Combine cream and cheese. Just before serving put a spoonful on each service.

Gingerbread Gems with Apples

Mix and sift together 2 tbs brown sugar, 1/2 tsp baking soda, 1 cup pastry flour, 1 cup whole wheat flour, 1/2 tsp ginger, 1 tsp cinnamon, 1/4 tsp mace and 1/2 tsp salt. Add 1/4 cup molasses, 1/4 c melted butter, 1/4 c raisins or currants. Then add 1 egg, well beaten & 2 tsp milk. Pare, core and cut 2 apples in 8ths pour batter mixture over the apples and bake in a moderate oven of 375 F for about 25 minutes
