**SOME IDEAS FOR CAKES**

"What kind of a cake shall I make?" is a question which often confronts the housewife in her efforts to put variety into her menu. Sponge cake, chocolate cake and spice cake are favorites with most people, but a change from these is usually welcomed.

Like any other mixture of food-stuffs, cakes may be entirely wholesome and nutritious, this depending upon the ingredients used in them.

Butter used in cakes not only adds to the food value because of its vitamin value, but produces a flavor which cannot be duplicated. In the same way, using milk and eggs in baking makes the product a more complete food as they increase the protein, mineral and vitamin content, especially needed when white flour is used.

**Some new ideas for cakes are:**

**Pineapple Butter Cake**  
1/2 cup butter,  
1 1/2 cups sugar  
4 eggs  
1 cup crushed pineapple, pulp and juice

2 1/2 cups flour  
3 teaspoons baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon vanilla

Cream butter well, add sugar gradually, creaming continually. Add eggs, one at a time, beating thoroughly. Fold into first mixture with vanilla. Bake in layers in moderately hot oven (375 degrees) 20 to 25 minutes; in a loaf in a moderate oven (325 degrees) 50 to 60 minutes.

**Apple Spice Cake**

2 1/2 cups pastry flour  
3 tsp. baking powder  
1/2 tsp salt  
1/2 tsp cinnamon  
1/2 tsp mace  
1/4 tsp allspice  
1/2 cup butter  
1-1/2 tsp cloves  
1 1/2 cups apples  
1 egg  
1 egg yolk  
1 cup sugar  
1/2 cup water  
1/2 pint whipping cream

Sift together dry ingredients; add finely chopped apples. Beat butter, eggs and sugar together for 3 minutes, or until thick. Add water, and fold in sifted dry ingredients and apples. Bake in layers in a moderately hot oven (375 degrees) 35 minutes; in

a loaf in a moderate oven (350 degrees) 1 hour. Put layers together with flavored whipped cream.

**Chocolate Cream Roll**

1-8 tsp salt  
1-3 tsp cream of tartar  
5 egg whites  
1 cup powdered sugar  
3 tsp cocoa  
1 tsp flour  
5 egg yolks  
1/2 pint whipping cream  
1 tsp vanilla

Add salt and cream of tartar to egg whites and beat until stiff and creamy. Sift powdered sugar, cocoa and flour together 4 times. Add to egg whites with yolks, beaten until light thick and lemon-colored, folding in gently. Pour into paper-lined jelly roll pan and bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) 20 to 25 minutes. Remove from pan, turn out on cloth, dusted with powdered sugar, and pull off paper. Spread with flavored whipped cream and roll up lightly.

**Sheep Dipping Vat Constructed**

**WHAT DOES YOUR WIFE DO?**

**Mix Your Vegetables**



ONE way to make vegetables more delicious and to vary their taste is to mix several kinds together. One way to make these dishes more economical and, at the same time, to have a wider variety of vegetables available is to mix canned vegetables with the fresh. Here are some of the combinations we would suggest:

**Creamed Mixed Vegetables:** Peel one large or two small cucumbers, and slice thin. Slice one cup of radishes thin without peeling. Boil separately until tender, drain and combine with the hot drained contents of a No. 1 can of peas. Add one cup of white sauce, and season to taste. Serves six or eight.

**Southern Peas and Onions:** Clean one bunch young onions and cut off tops. Then split them

lengthwise, and add with one slice bacon to half the contents of a No. 2 can peas. Add three-fourths cup boiling water, and boil until onions are tender. Add more water if necessary. Remove bacon, season to taste with salt and pepper, and serve. The liquid should be cooked almost away. Serves four.

**In Salads, Too**  
**Pea and Potato Salad:** Drain one 8-ounce can peas, add one and one-half cups diced boiled potatoes, one tablespoon chopped onion and one tablespoon chopped pimiento, and marinate in four tablespoons French dressing. Add two tablespoons chopped walnuts and one-third cup mayonnaise, and season to taste with salt, pepper and celery salt. Serve on lettuce leaves. Serves four.
