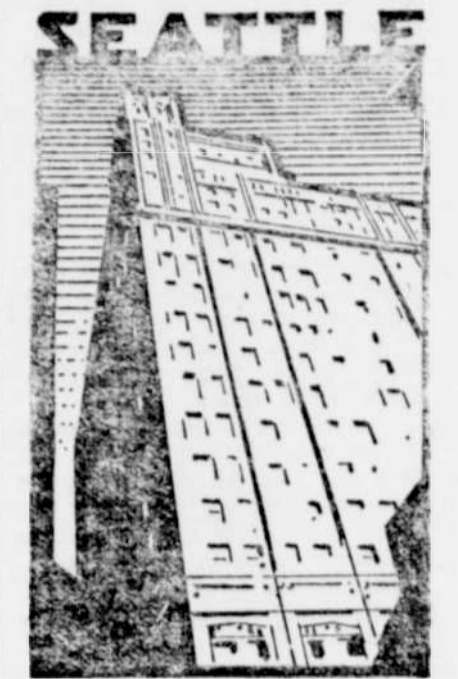

**WOMEN CONVICTS
TO LEARN TRADES**

**California Turns Prison Into
"School."**

Tehachapi, Calif.—In a peaceful, secluded little valley, nesting atop the Tehachapi divide, the state of California has launched one of the most progressive experiments in the history of penology.

It is the new \$500,000 state prison for women, located on the former 1,000-acre ranch in the Cummings valley, eleven miles from the town of Tehachapi.

No gray, dismal stone walls meet your vision as you approach. No iron-barred windows frown down. No forbidding guards stand sentry in machine-gun manned towers.

The four imposing buildings of reinforced concrete with red slate roofs house a prison, but—they also house a school where proper training in gainful occupations is to be given and a health unit where proper mental and psychological adjustments will be made that will change the inmates from menaces into useful citizens, when they have paid their debt to society.

Twenty-eight women comprise the first contingent of women prisoners transferred from San Quentin. They are serving time for every known crime—murder, forgery, theft, robbery. Some have long terms ahead of them. Others will be paroled soon. In this first group are three murderers.

The rest of the 145 women convicts will be transferred within the next few weeks.

Instead of cells, each will have a separate little room, with pastel-colored walls, gay cretonne curtains and boasting a single bed, a lowboy and a rocking chair.

In the industrial building, a complete domestic science course, sewing, laundry and other trades will be taught while those who prefer may turn "farmerette."

**Radio Devices to Aid
in Fight Against Crime**

New York—The relentless war on crime has produced two new weapons which will make the lawbreaker's lot even more hazardous.

Both are in experimental stages, but experts in the crime laboratories at the police department consider their perfection only a matter of time. The first is a device for broadcasting the portraits of criminals to radio cars. Recently, a radio car sped through Central park while officials gazed at a metal plate on the dashboard. Soon the slightly blurred, but unmistakable features of a man were imprinted on the plate.

"It was fairly successful," said Thomas W. Rochester, chief engineer of the radio department, "and although its installation is not feasible at present, it is coming."

The other invention will permit the broadcast of televised fingerprints. The principle of operation is simpler than with the photographs involving the use of wired lines available to any point of transmission.

"I should say this might be installed in the near future," Rochester said.

**Keeps 25-Year Vow to
Attend Friend's Funeral**

Cleburne, Texas.—More than a quarter of a century ago, O. H. Poole, publisher of the Cleburne Morning Review, and James (Buttermilk) Lowry, pioneer newspaper man of Honey Grove, entered into a solemn compact.

"No matter where I am," Lowry vowed, "I'll attend your funeral and make a five-minute speech."

"I'll do the same if you die first," Poole replied. "Only since I'm not a speechmaker, I'll leave that part out."

Recently, Poole stood beside the bier of his long-time friend, and fulfilled his vow.

**CHRISTMAS CANDIES THAT
CHILDREN CAN MAKE**

Not only has the housewife to plan and make or choose her own Christmas gifts but usually has to help solve this annual problem for every member of her family. A gift that a child has made will be much more appreciated than anything which is purchased for him to give.

What more logical gift is there than a box of home made candies which the children have made and packed? To add variety to the assortment, the cooking of some of the candy will require supervision but many need no cooking and are easily made and shaped.

For the grown-up looking for new ideas in candies there is a new folder 'How to Make Commercial Candies in your Home' which will be sent to you on request to this paper, or by writing me in care of the Dairy Council in Portland.

Some candy recipes that children can make are:

Peanut Butter Fudge

2 cups sugar
3/4 cup rich milk
or thin cream
4 Tbsp. Peanut butter
1 tsp. vanilla
1-8 tsp. salt
Boil sugar and milk to soft ball stage (238 degrees F). Let stand without beating until cool. Add peanut butter, vanilla and salt. Beat until creamy. Pour into buttered pan—cut in squares.

Butter Scotch

2 cups brown sugar
1 cup water
2 tsp. vinegar
1/2 cup butter
Boil together sugar, water and vinegar for ten minutes, then add butter and boil till hard crack (310 degrees

F). Turn into buttered pan. Mark off into squares while still warm.

Brownie Creams

1 cup confectioner's sugar (6X or 10X)
1 cup brown sugar
1 Tbsp. vanilla
2 Tbsp. cream
2 Tbsp. butter
Mix all ingredients together and work with the hands until smooth and creamy. Shape by teaspoonfuls into balls, set aside for 1 hour. Dip in melted chocolate and roll in toasted coconut.

Brazil Nut Fondant Stuffing

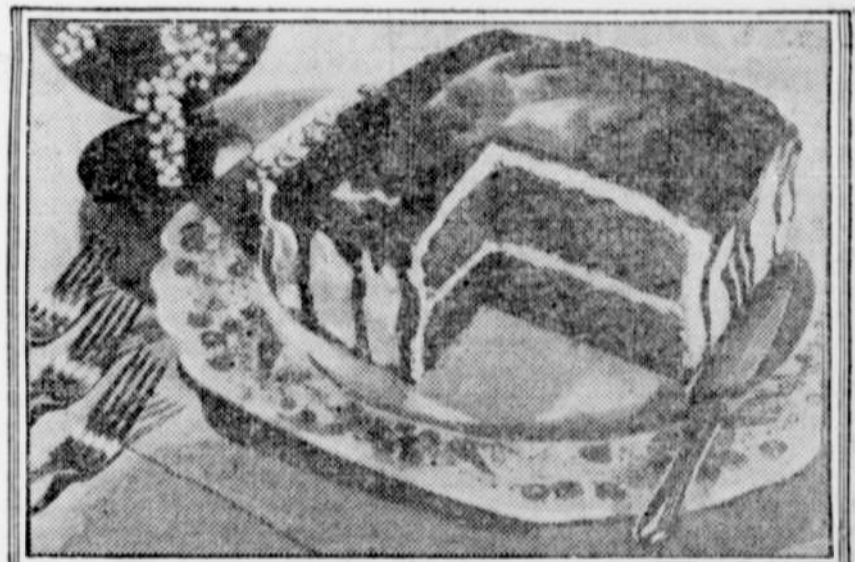
To 1-3 cups (1/2 pound) confectioner's sugar, add 1-8 tsp vanilla, 2 tsp. cream, and 2-3 cup (3 ounces) chopped Brazil nut meats. Place only a small quantity of the fondant in each prune or date so that the filling may be completely enclosed by the date and kept moist. (Brazil nuts are easily shelled if the nuts are steamed for 10 minutes before cracking.)

**Insure Your Cake Success
With Careful Measurements**



THE adage, "You can't have too much of a good thing," doesn't apply to cake baking.

Knowing that baking powder leavens cake it is natural to assume that a half teaspoon more will give a cake greater lightness. The sad, strange fact is that too much baking powder may cause sinking in the center, a tough gummy crust, coarse, dry crumb, or cake that runs over the pan—a dismal cake failure.

Let us rule out cake failure by following two simple baking powder rules. First, always use amount recommended on your baking powder can. This proportion has been worked out as best for that particular baking powder. Second, measure carefully—an excess of any type of baking powder gives undesirable results. A level teaspoon means that you must level off with a knife.

Make one of these cakes by these rules—you'll be surprised!

**Caramel Layer Cake
(2 Eggs)**

1 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
1 1/2 teaspoons combination baking powder
1 cup sugar
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup butter or other shortening
2 eggs, well beaten
1 teaspoon vanilla
Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder, and sift together three times. Cream butter thoroughly, add sugar gradually, and cream together until

light and fluffy. Add eggs, then flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time. Beat after each addition until smooth. Add vanilla. Bake in two greased 8-inch layer pans in moderate oven (375° F.) 25 minutes. Spread caramel frosting between layers and on top and sides of cake

**Creole Fudge Loaf
(1 egg)**

2 cups sifted cake flour
2 teaspoons combination baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup butter or other shortening
1 cup sugar
1 egg, well beaten
2 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted
1/2 cup milk
1 teaspoon vanilla
Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift together three times. Cream butter thoroughly, add sugar gradually, and cream together until light and fluffy. Add egg and beat well; then add chocolate. Blend, add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time. Beat after each addition until smooth. Add vanilla. Bake in greased pan, 8 x 8 x 2 inches, in moderate oven (325° F.) 1 hour. Spread boiled frosting on top and sides of cake. When frosting is set, pour on mixtures of 2 squares unsweetened chocolate and 2 tablespoons butter, melted, letting chocolate run down over sides of cake. Double recipe for two large layers.
