W. F. Johnson Explains

Johnson, poultry pathologist from Oregon State College, conducted the meeting and talked about disease control and poultry sanitation. Special emphasis was laid on the control and clean up methods for pullorum disease. This disease, Dr. Johnson said, can be 100% controlled and eliminated by doing away with carriers. He explained the method of locating cardraw the necessary blood samples. To strengthen the demonstration. three of the older club members actually drew samples from birds. Precautions against introducing this order disease into a clean flock were explained.

Dr. Johnson showed the group the proper method to handle birds for examination and treatment.
