MARVELS WITH BREAD CRUMBS

'Use bread to the last crumb' is a slogan which can be adopted by most housewives, as the possibilities for using bread crumbs are about numberless. Transforming left-over breads of all kinds into delicious puddings, croquettes, timbales, stuffings, scallops, fondues and au gratin dishes can become much the same kind of a thrill as making an attractive suit for the young son out of a discarded topcoat of his father's.

Bread crumbs are really a quickly available form of flour that is seasoned, cooked and ready for the baking dish or cooking kettle. When crumbs are combined with milk, butter and eggs, they contain the necessary protective elements—vitamins and minerals which make them truly nutritious foods.

Some recipes utilizing bread crumbs are:

Corn au Gratin

2 cups canned corn
2 small green peppers
1 onion, finely chopped
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup flour
2 tsp. salt
1 cup milk
2 egg yolks
1 cup dried bread
2 tsp. butter
1 cup buttered breadcrumbs
1/2 cup grated cheese

Cook pepper, onion and butter five minutes. Add flour, and seasonings and stir until well blended. Add milk stirring constantly. Bring to boiling point and add cheese, corn, egg yolks and bread broken into a buttered baking dish, cover with buttered bread crumbs and bake in hot oven until crumbs are brown.

1 cup milk
1 cup bread crumbs
1/2 cup butter
3 eggs beaten
1/2 tsp salt
1/2 cup grated cheese
-1 tsp. onion juice
A little chopped celery
Cook macaroni. Scald 1 cup milk and pour over bread crumbs. Add all other ingredients. Butter pan thoroughly and turn in mixture. Set mold in pan of water and bake in slow oven until firm in center, about 1/2 hour.

Molasses Brown Betty

1/2 cup molasses
1/2 cup cold water
Juice and rind of 1/2 lemon.
1 cup sugar
1 tsp cinnamon
1/2 tsp cloves
2 cups dry bread crumbs
1/2 cup butter
6 tart apples
Make a syrup out of the molasses water, sugar, spices, lemon juice, cooking briskly for 3 minutes. Wash apples but do not peel, slice thin. Alternate layers of apples and bread crumbs in a well-buttered baking dish. Pour hot syrup over them and bake in a moderate oven until apples are tender.

TWO OREGON DAIRY MEETS SCHEDULED FOR FEBRUARY

The annual convention of the Oregon Dairymen's association has been announced for La Grande, February 16 and 17, and the annual convention and short course of the Oregon Butter and Ice Cream Makers' association at Oregon State college February 19 to 22, by the officers of these two major dairy groups of the state. President George Fullenwider of the Dairymen's association is preparing for an up-to-date program for the producers which will bring them the latest developments in the prospective AAA program for dairy production control. Other features will also be included on the program, including addresses by some nationally known men that are being obtained for the meeting.

Butter and ice cream makers of the state never fail to turn out in large numbers for their combined business and educational meeting at the college. This year President F. F. Moser of Corvallis is promising a convention program second to none in the past. Featured among the speakers is Dr. B. W. Hammer, dairy bacteriologist at Iowa State college.

COMMERCIAL CANNERS TO ATTEND O. S. C. CLASSES

Men interested in commercial canning, whether beginners or old timers at the business, are being provided for in plans just announced for the thirteenth annual canners' school offered by the division of horticultural products at Oregon State college February 5 to 17. This short course is distinctly an Oregon institution and draws students each year from other states and even foreign lands.

This year the training course in handling canning machines will be held each afternoon right through the entire course. Forenoon for the first week will be devoted to fundamental work especially for beginners or those engaged in community canning operations, though much of interest to professionals will be included. The forenoon of the second week will be devoted to more advanced work in canning, with opportunity provided for additional conferences with other members of the college staff on any related subjects.

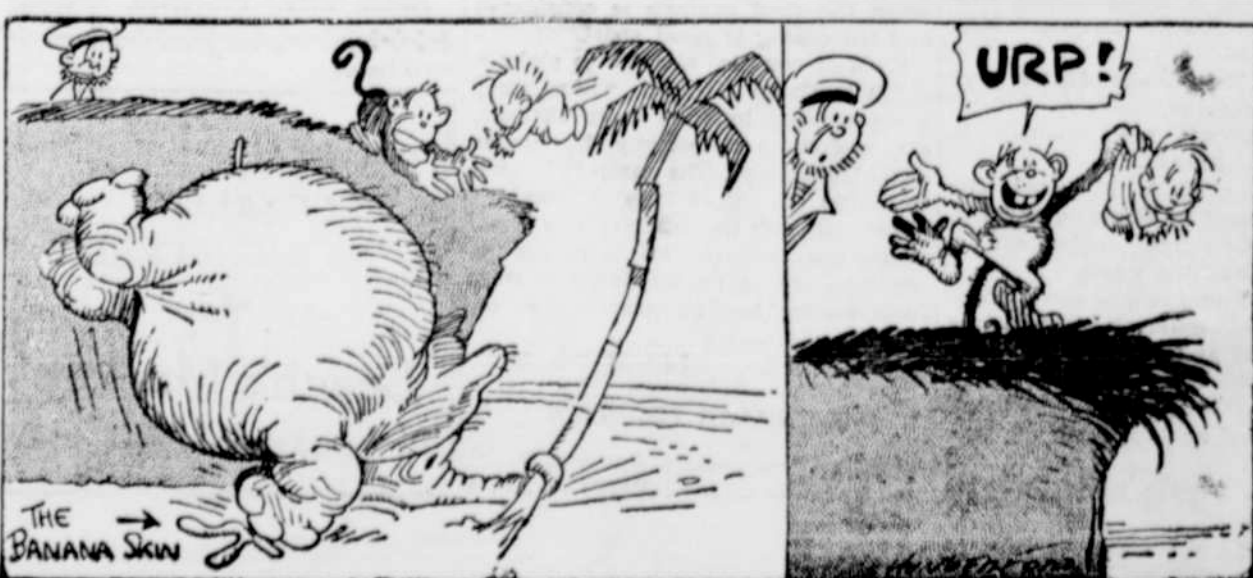
