MILK AN ALL-ROUND FOOD

With a generous supply of milk for the family on hand, housewives have the basis for many tasty dishes as well as the most important essential for a well-balanced meal. If luncheon or supper is to provide a cream soup or a chowder, milk will be the chief ingredient. In making of hot breads, biscuits, muffins and rolls, milk plays an important part. In the preparation of the main dishes of the meal—vegetable, meat, cheese or egg combinations, milk has a leading role. Custards, filling for pies, cakes, cookies, ice cream and candies demand milk for a perfect product.

As a beverage, whole milk is nutritious in its natural state, or it may be served as hot chocolate, cocoa, café au lait, or blended with fruit juices it becomes a cooling, refreshing milk drink.

Whole milk has long been recognized as the most important single food. For good health, there are certain definite essentials which the body requires every day. These essentials are the vitamins, minerals, protein and energy materials. Of these essential food needs, a quart of milk daily provides over one-half the necessary amount for an adult child. Every quart bottle of milk contains calcium and phosphorus (the minerals from which teeth and bones are made) an eighth of the daily supply of iron; protection in Vitamin A, besides the vitamins B, G, D, a high quality of protein and one-fourth to one-fifth of the day's energy supply.

The housewife who is interested in economy and family health will provide their children with a quart of milk daily. The grown-up members of the family too, for best health and efficiency, are in need of, at least a pint and preferably one quart of milk or its equivalent each day.

The following milk dishes are delicious for luncheon or supper.

Navy Bean Chowder

- 1 c navy beans
- 2 oz lean & fat pork, salt
- 5 c diced carrots
- 1½ c potatoes, diced
- ½ c onions, thinly sliced
- 3 tbsp finely chopped parsley
- ½ tsp salt
- 1 tsp pepper
- 1 c milk
- 3 tbsp butter

Wash beans, drain; cover with cold water and let stand overnight. In morning place on low fire and cook gently until soft. Drain pork, place in frying pan and saute to golden color. Add to beans with prepared vegetables and seasonings and boil 12 minutes; reduce heat, add milk and butter, reheat and serve.

Cream of Beet Soup

- 2 small onions
- 2 tbsp butter
- 1 c water
- 2 c finely chopped fresh or canned beets
- ½ c meat stock
- 1½ tsp salt
- Pepper
- 2½ c whole milk
- 1½ tsp vinegar

Cut onion fine and cook in the butter until soft and yellow. Add water and meat stock and heat to the boiling point. (If meat stock is not available a beef or chicken bouillon cube may be dissolved in ½ cup boiling water.) Add salt and pepper and the milk and again reheat to the boiling point. Remove from the fire, add the vinegar and serve at once.

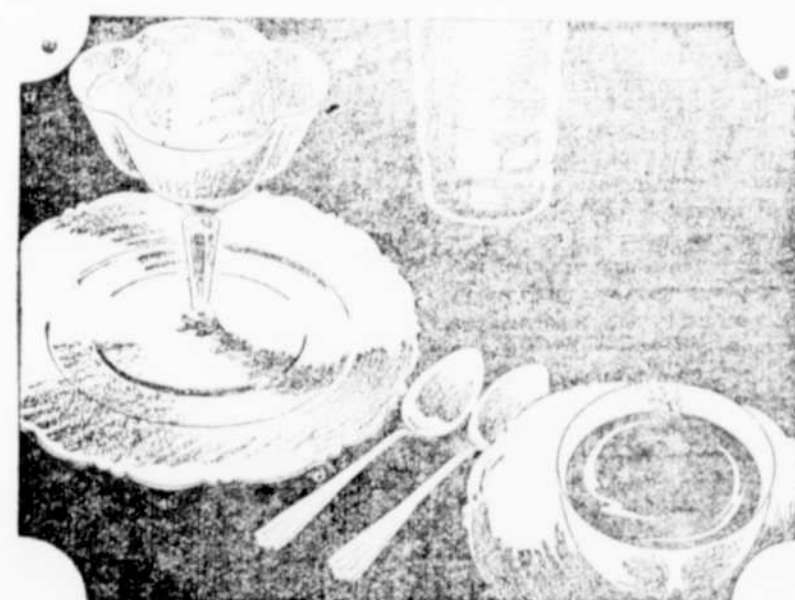

A \$1.50 Dinner for 6

THE interest of the following dinner lies in the fact that it serves six people for \$1.50, and tastes mighty good to half a dozen of them. Here's the menu:

Broiled Pork Chops with Fried Apples 50c
Radishes 8c
Baked Stuffed Peppers 25c
Battered Cauliflower 30c
Raisin Bread and Butter 13c
Fluffy Rice Pudding 11c
Coffee with Cream 10c

Baked Stuffed Peppers: Cut three large green peppers in halves lengthwise, and remove seeds and white membrane. Par-boil one minute, drain and lay in a flat, shallow, slightly greased baking pan (or pie plate). Break one-fourth of a package of macaroni in small pieces, boil until

tender, and drain. Simmer for a few minutes one-half the contents of a No. 2 can of tomatoes, one-half teaspoon grated onion, salt and pepper, and add the macaroni and fill the pepper cases. Cover with one-third cup grated cheese. Bake in a moderate oven until the cheese is brown.

Fluffy Rice Pudding: Parboil three tablespoons rice in salted boiling water for ten minutes, then drain. Scald the contents of a 6-ounce can of evaporated milk with three-fourths cup water, add the rice and cook in a double boiler until very soft. Mix one third cup sugar with one beaten egg yolk, add to the rice and cook one minute longer. Cool. Beat the egg white and fold in with one-fourth cup beaten cream. Chill. Serve in glasses with a sprinkling of nutmeg on top.
