# HI-WAYS TO HEALTH

**THE ASPARAGUS SEASON**

'Buy green and yellow vegetables first' is advice from food authorities, and with the markets now showing an abundance of fresh asparagus, this advice is easily and pleasantly followed. One or more vegetables or fruits should be included in the family diet every day. Yellow vegetables such as carrots, rutabaga and yellow corn, and green vegetables as asparagus, green beans, green cabbage, and all varieties of vegetables known as 'greens' are superior to similar vegetables lacking green or yellow color.

Buttered vegetables are delicious when cooked just right. Vegetables should not be cooked too long as they lose their pleasant fresh flavor as well as their color. Ten or fifteen minutes of cooking time is all that is required to cook fresh asparagus, using just enough boiling salted water to cook.

The superb way to serve asparagus is with Hollandaise Sauce or with a generous amount of butter and served piping hot. For variety, however, other ways of serving asparagus are suggested.

**Hollandaise Sauce**

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 tsp vinegar or 1 tsp lemon juice
- 2 egg yolks
- 1/4 teaspoon of salt and a few grains of cayenne.

Divide the butter into three pieces. Put one piece in a double boiler with vinegar or lemon juice and egg yolks. Stir constantly with wire whisk or spoon until butter is melted. Add second piece of butter and as mixture thickens, add third piece. Remove from fire add salt and cayenne and serve at once.

**Mushrooms and Asparagus**

- 1 pound mushrooms or 1 medium sized can
- 1 bunch fresh asparagus
- 2 hard-cooked eggs
- 6 tsp butter
- 3 tsp flour
- 2 cupfuls milk
- 1 tsp chopped parsley
- 1 tsp salt
- 1-8 tsp pepper

Wash and stem mushrooms, reserving the stems for soup. Saute the sliced tops in 3 tsp butter until tender, about 5 minutes. Clean the asparagus, cut the edible stalks into 2 inch pieces and cook until tender. Meanwhile melt 3 tsp butter in a saucepan, add the flour and stir until

smooth. Then add the milk gradually, salt and pepper. When well-blended and thickened, add mushrooms, asparagus and sliced hard-cooked eggs. Reheat and serve.

**Creamed Ham and Asparagus**

- 1 bunch asparagus
- 3 tsp butter
- 3 tsp flour
- 1-8 tsp paprika
- Speck pepper.
- 1 cup ground cooked or baked ham
- 1 1/2 cupfuls milk
- 6 slices of toast

Wash, prepare and cook asparagus until tender. Meanwhile melt butter in saucepan. Add flour, stir until blended, then add milk gradually while stirring constantly. When smooth and thickened, add ham, paprika and pepper. Pour over hot asparagus arranged on toast and serve at once. Serves 6.

**BUTTER WILL BE GRADED**

Oregon housewives will no longer be confused by grade names in buying butter when the butter Marketing Agreement goes into effect on April 15, because of the adoption by all creameries of the state of a new method of designating the three butter grades.

In the future, the best grade of butter will be labeled A grade butter, the second grade B, and the third grade, (very little of which is ever put out in prints for home sale), will bear the label C. Butterfat will likewise be graded and purchased on the premium basis and it is felt that this will result in a larger return to butterfat producers, an improvement in the average of Oregon butter and an increased consumption of butter due to improved quality.



**A Time Saver**

THE superintendent of a large hospital once said that she insisted upon everything being always put back in its place because this system had proved a great time saver. This would be difficult to do in the average household, but there are many ways, which are totally unnecessary, in which a housewife wastes time. She looks up some things time after time without ever making a note of them, although she knows that she will need them again.

Here's a way, for instance, in which she can save time in her kitchen by means of a bit of system which will help her not only in her cooking but in her shopping. Clip out the following table of the average number of cupfuls and the average net weight of the fruits and vegetables found in the standard sizes of cans, and paste it on your kitchen cupboard door, on the flyleaf of your recipe book, or somewhere in the kitchen where it will be plainly visible.

Size of Can	Average Net Weight	Average Cupfuls
8 oz.	8 oz.	1
Picnic	11 oz.	1 1/3 (No. 1 Eastern)
No. 1 tall	16 oz.	2
No. 2	20 oz.	2 1/2
No. 2 1/2	28 oz.	3 1/2
No. 3	33 oz.	4
No. 10	6 lbs. 10 oz.	13

These weights and measures are based on cans of tomatoes, and other fruits and vegetables will vary a bit naturally from these figures, but they are sufficiently accurate to enable a housewife to order the proper size of can at the grocer's if she knows how many cupfuls of the product will be needed for her recipe.
