MAKE EVERY MONTH COUNT FOR HEALTH

Only the well child is a happy child. While the month of May has been set aside as Child Health Month the wise parent will see to it that their children are healthy throughout the year.

The designation of May, however, has its value, for it brings vividly before all the importance of child health, and focuses the attention of mothers, in particular, on the necessity for more closer observance of their youngsters' health.

Spring Stock Taking

So it behooves every mother at this time to conduct a Spring stocktaking of her children's physical condition. The most certain and only logical method, of course, is a thorough examination by the family doctor. He can tell exactly what the child needs, and if, perchance, he finds a minor physical defect can advise as to its correction.

He will be able to outline a really well balanced menu for the child, one that will perhaps be needed to correct and maladjustments; he will point out the best ways to provide fresh air and sunshine so necessary for good health, and he will help the mother arrange a regimen best suited to her child.

Every mother should have the advice of her doctor in the care of her children. It is unwise to follow the advice of relatives or well meaning friends, for frequently the life of her child is at stake. A medical man is trained to recognize the early signs of ill health. The laity usually does not recognize disease until it is well established hence it is only the physician's advice that should be sought and heeded and therefore, too, the physical inventory, or health examination should be made only by the family doctor.

Hi-WAYS TO HEALTH

FOR MOTHER'S DAY

Sunday is to be Mother's Day and everywhere thought will be centered upon ways to pay tribute to the mothers of the nation. What greater consideration could be given to any mother than for her family to take over the household duties for the day. To be relieved of the usual household tasks would make it a special occasion for mother and a gala event for father and the children, especially if they plan, prepare and serve the dinner.

Even if the father of the household seldom shows interest in kitchen activities he can engineer the following menu, with the help of the younger members. For Mother's Day then, with father as the cook, this menu is planned.

Roast Stuffed Leg of Veal
Baked Potatoes Buttered Green Peas
Buttermilk Biscuits
Sliced Tomato & Lettuce Salad
Fresh Strawberry Ice Cream Sundae
Milk for children Coffee for adults

Roast Stuffed Leg of Veal

4 1/2 lbs leg of veal boned for stuffing
3 cups soft bread crumbs
4 1/2 teaspoons salt
1 1/2 tsp onion juice
1 1/2 tsp sage
1 1/2 cups finely chopped celery
1/2 cup butter
About 5 tsp flour
1 tsp lemon juice
1 cup rich milk

This is best cooked in a Dutch oven. Wipe veal clean on the outside. Pre-

pare the stuffing of the crumbs and add to them the melted butter, the sage, celery, one teaspoon salt and pepper. Mix lightly but enough to distribute the seasonings. Stuff the cavity with this dressing and tie with string. Rub the outside of the veal with lemon juice and then with the rest of the salt and flour. Sear the roast in 3 tablespoons hot butter to an even golden brown. Add 1 cup water cover closely and cook for 3 or 4 hours. When ready to serve remove the meat and add the cream to the gravy in the bottom of the oven or roasting pan. Thicken with 2 extra tablespoons of flour mixed smooth with 2 tablespoons of water. Cook for at least 10 minutes. A delicious and handsome meat dish which is the equal of the chicken. Yield: 8 large or 10 medium servings.

Buttermilk Biscuits

2 cups pastry flour
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon soda
1 tsp baking powder
3 tbsps butter
1 cup buttermilk (thick)
Sift flour, then measure. Resift twice with the salt, soda and baking powder. Work the butter in with the tips of the fingers. Add the milk all at once. Stir together quickly, and sprinkle a thick dusting of flour on a dough board. Knead the dough lightly for two or three minutes. Pat the dough out lightly to a thickness of about 1/2 inch. Cut and place on a baking sheet. Bake in a hot oven (425 degrees F) for ten or twelve minutes or to the preferred brown.

Two Useful Fruits

EVERYBODY likes grapefruit, and everybody likes pineapple, but have you ever thought of combining these two useful fruits in recipes which should thus be doubly appealing to the palate? If you haven't, here are some which will show you how to do it.

Pineapple and Grapefruit Shortcake: Roll three-fourths cup canned pineapple syrup, three-fourths cup canned grapefruit syrup and two tablespoons sugar five minutes. Cool, add two cups diced canned pineapple and two cups canned grapefruit sections and serve on hot, rich baking powder biscuits, split and buttered. This makes enough for eight.

A Combination Salad
Pineapple and Grapefruit Salad with Cheese Dressing: Drain the contents of two 8-ounce cans of Hawaiian pineapple tidbits (or one and one-half cups diced sliced pineapple), and toss lightly with one cup canned grapefruit sections, one cup orange sections and one-half cup halved, seeded grapes. Pile in lettuce leaves and pour over the following cheese dressing. Serves eight.

Cheese Dressing: Shake together in six tablespoons salad oil, one tablespoon lemon juice, one tablespoon pineapple syrup, and salt and paprika to taste. Smooth slowly into four tablespoons crumbled Roquefort cheese, and add two tablespoons chopped pimiento.

A Cocktail for March 17
Emerald Isle Cocktail: Combine the syrup from a No. 2 can of Hawaiian sliced pineapple and a No. 2 can of grapefruit, sweeten slightly if desired with confectioner's sugar, add one-half teaspoon almond flavoring, and tint a delicate green with vegetable coloring. Cut the pineapple slices in quarters, and distribute with the grapefruit sections among eight glasses. Pour over the syrup, and chill. Serves eight.
