

FAMOUS ORGANIST TO GIVE RECITAL IN PORTLAND

Gunther Ramin, Germany's most distinguished living organist of the famous St. Thomas church in Leipzig, will give an organ recital on the great concert organ in the Portland Municipal Auditorium Friday evening, October 26, at 8:00 o'clock. Mr. Ramin is the organist and cantor in the church made so famous by the great Johann Sebastian Bach. He is Professor of organ at the Leipzig Conservatory and the State High School of Berlin, as well as being the organist of Gewandhaus Orchestra and Conductor of the Gewandhaus Choir of Leipzig.

In 1933 this great organist made his first American tour, appearing only in the East, where his concerts were a series of ovations. He is unquestionably Germany's most celebrated organist and one of the world's most famous.

Lauren B. Sykes, the local Concert Manager, promises a program especially interesting to lovers of good music.

There will be a number of well known German Chorals especially arranged for the organ by Mr. Ramin.

There will be two prices of admission—50c (tax included) for adults—and 25c for high and grammar school students.

All seats will be reserved, and mail orders are now being received.

The organ console at the Auditorium will be elevated to the center of the concert stage where everyone may see as well as hear this great Master.
