chance of reaching him. It looked like  
a kind of a quick afterthought with no  
idea of really kicking him.

I talked with both of em in their  
dressing rooms right after, and Med-  
wick said he really didn't mean any-  
thing, and he don't know why he really  
did it, and that he offered to shake  
hands when they got up. I do know he  
felt terribly bad about it. Owen was  
very nice in his explanation of it. He  
said he fell across him reaching for the  
ball. Well then there must have been  
a ball there, and he ought to know. But  
by golly I just didn't see the ball come

on the whole circuit, Pittsburg, and the  
Red Sox Park in Boston, and Phila-  
delphia, and as we only showed at  
night we had nothing to do all day  
but be around with the ball players, then  
get my pony out at night, and Buck Mc-  
Kee who rode him for me, and run him  
him. And it was great to get to do it on  
the ground, and not on a stage, we had  
so much more room outdoors. I liked  
that work but the thing didn't go so  
good, and of course all of us acts were  
just transferred back into the theatres  
instead, but I met and become ac-  
quainted with many a fine fellow. And  
lots of em I saw at the games. Every-  
body ought to see em. It keeps you  
young and interested.
