The hole, fill in with the soil that has been removed and water thoroughly. Take good care of your trees, because after all "Only God can make a Tree."

For hedge planting use one half pound of plant food to each twenty five running feet of hedge.

Next week I will start a series of articles dealing with varieties of vegetables and flower seeds, their cultural time and habits.

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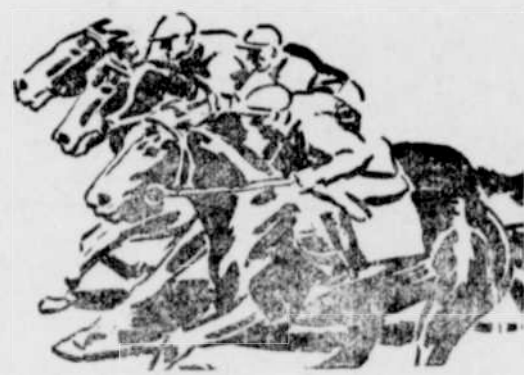
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
