

## Luscious Fruit Puddings



How welcome a fruit pudding, when the first course has been substantial! With quick-cooking tapioca as an ingredient, you have an ideal combination with fruit—the tapioca making an inviting, smooth contrast to the grateful fresh-tasting fruit. At the same time, tapioca adds its generous quota of nourishment to the dessert.

## Baked Apple Tapioca

3 cups water  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
3 tart apples, pared and sliced  
1/2 cup quick-cooking tapioca  
1 cup light brown sugar, firmly packed  
1 teaspoon salt  
3 tablespoons melted butter

Combine water and lemon juice and pour over apples in greased shallow baking dish. Cover and bake in moderate oven (375°F.) 15 minutes, or until apples are par-

tially cooked. Mix together quick-cooking tapioca, 1/2 cup sugar, salt, and mace. Sprinkle over apples, mixing thoroughly. Add butter. Continue baking 10 minutes. Then stir well; sprinkle remaining sugar over apple mixture, and bake 6 minutes longer. Serve hot or cold with cream. Serves 6.

## Deep-dish Cherry Pudding

1/2 cup quick-cooking tapioca  
1 cup brown sugar, firmly packed  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon  
2 cups canned sour cherries, drained  
1/2 cup water and cherry juice  
1 tablespoon lemon juice  
2 tablespoons melted butter

Combine ingredients in greased baking dish. Mix thoroughly. Bake in moderate oven (375°F.) 30 minutes, or until done, stirring well every 10 minutes, and again when removing from oven. Serves 8.

## The Growers of Bulbs Very Apprehensive

## Threatened by Heavy Importations From Foreign Shores

The bulb growers of Oregon and other states will have an uneasy feeling until they learn the exact provisions of the pending reciprocal trade agreement with the Netherlands and her colonies. In years gone by, Holland furnished us with most of our bulbs. Then it became necessary to place an embargo upon these imports because of plant disease.

Since then American growers have been producing enough bulbs to more than supply our domestic needs. More than six million different varieties of bulbs are now grown in the United States, and it is declared that the American product is superior to that imported. Any lowering of tariff rates on bulbs under the pending agreement would naturally be disastrous to American growers.

The details of a trade agreement with Italy are also being worked out by the State Department at this time. Domestic cherry growers have a stake in seeing that the present tariff on cherries is not reduced in connection with this agreement. On the Pacific coast alone there are approximately 250,000 individuals wholly or partially

dependent for their living upon the production of cherries grown on more than 62,000 farms.

## Spray for "Red Berry" Advised

MEDFORD—Spraying of blackberries and Youngberries with liquid lime sulfur—one gallon to 12 gallons of water—before the buds break open as a means of controlling the "red berry" is advised by County Agent L. P. Wilcox. This so-called "disease" is in reality caused by a small mite, he says, which works its way into the buds during the bloom period and injures the berries, causing them to remain red in color and fail to mature, resulting in severe crop losses. He suggests that in communities where wild blackberries are harvested it would be well to make some community effort to spray the vines.

## Oregon Pigs Received in China

A shipment of breeding pigs assembled by the animal husbandry department at Oregon State College arrived safely in China recently where they have been ordered for use by government colleges to improve the swine there. The shipment consisted of pedigreed porkers from leading breeders of western Oregon and from the experiment station herd. They were transported in a special pen built on the deck of a lumber vessel.
