The United States government now owns 22 embassy and legation buildings at the following capitals: Tirana, Albania; Buenos Aires, Argentina; Rio de Janeiro, Brazil; Ottawa, Canada; Santiago, Chile; Peking, China; San Jose, Costa Rica; Havana, Cuba; Prague, Czechoslovakia; Paris, France; London, England; Tokyo, Japan; Rome, Italy; Mexico City, Mexico; Managua, Nicaragua; Oslo, Norway; Panama, Panama; Teleran, Persia; San Salvador, El Salvador; Bangkok, Siam; Istanbul, Turkey; Tangier, Morocco. This last mission ranks as a legation, although Tangier is not the capital of Morocco, but a city having an international status.

The Social Room Plan

In one of the large western cities, a unique and interesting plan of a social center for the high school has been established and is proving very successful.

The theory behind the innovation is that the entertainment sought by high school students, often at undesirable times and places, can be supplanted by properly supervised social activities which are provided by the high school.

Centralizing this plan, is a large room in each high school building. This room serves as a lounging room for students, a meeting place for both business and social chats, an auditorium for presentations and a hall for dances and parties.

A well-arranged and carefully-planned program is worked out, at the beginning of each term, by a group, consisting of the principal, the dean of girls, and a representative student committee of boys and girls. The dean of girls is the official chairman of this group.

The program for the term consists of informal gatherings of students, matinee dances, afternoon and evening parties, plays, teas, and musicals. Some event is planned for each Saturday night and for each Friday night on which there is no conflicting school event.

The students enter into the plan enthusiastically, enjoy the activities with their school-friends, have a co-operative spirit for their school, receive much valuable social training, and are provided with wholesome,



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well-supervised and interesting amusement. This is a plan well worth watching, in interest of the leisure hours of our high school boys and girls.

State House Gossip

Second, the proposal to move drouth victims to the Willamette valley in Oregon may require legislative appropriations for the creation of an engineering force to make preparations and further there may be some tax base changes necessary before the federal government will take steps. It was estimated Oregon could take care of at least 25,000 persons.

Third, if there is a session unquestionably the cabinet form of government will be proposed. And if it is brought up there are excellent chances of its passage. The system is a pet of Budget Director D. O. Hood, and it is understood he was anxious there be a special session so work could be started on the move for placing most of the state government directly under the governor.

But friends of the administration give some definite reasons why the governor should not call the session. In the first place, they argue, any changes necessary in the social security act may be done without assembly. Also they argue the proposal to move drouth victims to Oregon is but a myth and was the result of the ingenuity of the mind of D. O. Hood when he was in the National Capitol.

These friends also argue that it would be no time to bring up the cabinet form of Government, but that isn't all. Threats of recall of the governor, they fear, would be enhanced, and also that a demand for a public investigation of state relief funds would be made by the legislature.

The latter idea was advanced upon predictions the present investigation by the Governor's committee will not result in finding anything radically wrong, and little will be reported by the group which has just completed its hearings and is now in executive session preparing the report. Those demanding open probe will argue the governor and his committee had suppressed irregularities. So the pendulum swings back and forth, with the majority feeling there will be a session.

The possibility of such a session has prevented the governor from naming more members of the legislature to state positions at this time. Should he do so, the small democratic lead in the house may be seized by republicans, giving that party full control of both houses—the senate now being republican.

A special session would be limited to 20 days only. While the regular session was set up as 40 days, members may continue on indefinitely, but without pay. But the constitution limits extra-ordinary session to 20 days, and the meet must end at that time. The Governor, of course, could call another one immediately if the work had not been completed. There is no limit as to the number of these sessions a Governor may call.

With recall threats on all sides, one can't help but wonder who might be governor within a short time. Townsends and grange are threatening recall against Martin. Portland people have said Harry Corbett, president of the senate and well in line would also be recalled. And John E. Cooter, speaker of the house, was expected to accept a federal post which would disqualify him from the legislature.

Therefore the special session would have a bearing on the next governor—maybe, Moore Hamilton, Medford Democrat, is in line for the speakership should Cooter resign. Many things can happen, and from the way events are shaping up, these reports are more than idle rumors.
