A Culinary Poem

But there are many recipes for a Plato tomatoyto, and the friend failed to specify which one he Otto eat. So, in order to complete the story, here is a tomato recipe which neither rhyme nor reason can keep from being a culinary poem:

Tomato Ring with Persian Melon Balls: Strain the contents of a No. 2 can of tomatoes, add one-half teaspoon salt and on teaspoon sugar, and bring to boiling. Soak five teaspoons gelatin in four tablespoons cold water, and dissolve in hot tomato juice. Cool and chill. When about ready to set, add one-half cup mayonnaise, form into a wet ring mold, and set in ice box to stiffen. Meanwhile, cut a Persian melon in small balls, and marinate them in French dressing. When ready to serve, turn tomato ring out onto a round platter and fill center with melon balls. Around the ring place small hearts of lettuce filled with mayonnaise. Serves eight.

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WAR ON BANK ROBBERS

National Bankers Association
Pressing Active Steps to
Protect Members—
Losses Cut

Imprisonment or death of many desperate bank criminals the past year has brought no appreciable reduction in attacks on banks. James E. Baum, in charge of the American Bankers Association Protective Department, has reported to his organization.

In the six months ended February 28, 1935, he says, banks were targets for 169 daylight holdups and 40 night burglaries. He added that although banks that are not members number only about half those enrolled in the association, they suffered a far greater rate of attack, namely, 51 per cent of all the bank robberies committed during the period.

Losses Show Decrease

During the period under report, bank burglars and bandits exacted tribute amounting to \$943,551 compared with losses totaling \$1,257,000 a year ago, he said. This reduction in losses is attributed to the time-locking restrictions and other limitations in the exposure of surplus cash imposed last year by underwriters and several bank supervisory authorities.

The sharp reduction in the material loss of money and securities resulting from bank robbery this year was "over shadowed by the killing of 2 bank employees, one bystander and 5 arresting officers," and since last August bank robbery also cost the lives of 15 criminals and caused physical injuries to 10 bank employees, 12 bystanders, 9 arresting officers and 8 bandits a total of 62 casualties.

Investigations by the association's agents resulted in the arrest of 26 forgers, 42 bandits and one burglar, or 79 of the 141 bank criminals reported as being apprehended during the period.

Rural Electrification Vital, Says Gov. Martin

Program of Federal Cooperation
Outlined in Address at Big
O. S. C. Banquet

Rural electrification is the "problem of the hour" which is receiving his closest attention, Governor Charles H. Martin assured 650 college and high school agricultural students, and farm leaders from all parts of the state at the annual agricultural leaders banquet held in connection with the state Future Farmers of America convention at Oregon State college.

"It is a program that can be successfully worked out only through closest cooperation with the federal government," Governor Martin declared. "I have recently urged President Roosevelt to make necessary studies and give authority . . . for construction of the main transmission lines from Bonneville dam as part of the original construction program."

"As at least three states of Oregon, Washington and Idaho will share in the consumption of power generated at Bonneville, it is obvious that the federal government alone is in a position to construct these main transmission lines. . . . Our state is in no financial condition, nor is it proper for this state, to assume the building of \$60,000,000 worth of power transmission lines."

The governor pointed out that once the main lines are built, the farmers themselves will have a part to perform. They have an opportunity now to prepare under the Oregon power district laws to distribute locally the cheap power once it is delivered to their communities.

"Electrification means, in the long run, better living and working conditions on our farms and a greater return to our farmers," he added. "This program is of such vital importance that it must and shall be kept out of petty politics. I pledge to you my unswerving efforts to accomplish this great purpose."

Governor Martin voiced a plea for state unity in the great development he sees ahead. Before we are farmers, lawyers, or merchants we are Oregonians, he said.

"When popular discontent and passion are stimulated by the art of designing partisans to a pitch perilously near class hatred. I would have our universities and colleges sound the alarm in the name of American brotherhood and fraternal dependence."
