**Stuff'n' Dates**

WHEN THE ADMITTED STATES HAD NO STARS ON THE AMERICAN FLAG

THE FIRST ADOPTION OF THE AMERICAN FLAG WAS ABOUT 1777. THE FLAG BELONGED TO BARON DE CALVES AT FORT SCHUYLER. THEN BESEGED BY THE BRITISH THE GARRISON THOSE OF LINEN SHIRTS FOR WHITE STRIPES, PATCHED TOGETHER WITH BITS OF SCARLET CLOTH AND THE BLUE, WAS MADE FROM A CLOAK CAPTURED FROM A BRITISH OFFICER.

IT HAD BEEN FIRST ADOPTED BY CONGRESS ON JUNE 14, 1777 (WHICH DAY HAS BEEN KNOWN AS FLAG DAY SINCE 1893) IT HAD THIRTEEN STRIPES, AND ITS FIELD OF BLUE.

IN 1796 TENNESSEE SEED ONE (1812 LOUISIANA) WAS ADDED TO THE UNION MAKING A TOTAL OF FORTY STATES. IN APRIL, 1868 CONGRESS PASSED AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE FLAG OF THE U.S. THE PRESENT FLAG WAS ADOPTED AND A LAW FOR EVERY STATE IS TO BE INSTALLED ON THE 4th OF JULY, FOLLOWING THE DATE OF ADOPTION.
