

New Model Ford on Display Saturday

Mr. Johnston, local Ford Dealer returned yesterday from Seattle where he attended the preview showing of the new Ford V-8 for 1936. Hawaii May Possibly Be the 49th State

Ten members of Congress, in company with Samuel Wilder King, delegate to Congress from Hawaii, recently sailed from San Francisco to visit this possession of the United States, with a view to recommending the admission of Hawaii as the 49th state of the Union. Mr. King introduced a bill on this subject at the last session of Congress and it is still pending.

Hawaii, which was annexed to the United States in 1898, is at present under a territorial form of government. Its chief city is Honolulu, which is 2100 miles from San Francisco.

The Hawaiian Islands, formerly known as the Sandwich Islands, are looked upon as the crossroads of the Pacific Oceans. They are 20 in number, but only nine are inhabited. According to the census of 1930, the population was 368,000, representing an increase of 43 per cent over the previous decade. Of this number, less than 22,000 are of native Hawaiian stock. Among the other nationalities represented in the population of the Islands are the following:—Japanese, 139,000; Chinese, 27,000; Korean, 6,000; Filipinos, 63,000, and Portuguese, 27,000.

Whether the American melting pot would be capable of assimilating these heterogeneous racial groups and mold them into a pattern deserving of statehood, is a question which Congress will be called upon to decide.

the question of labor efficiency will locate industries.

History Repeats Itself

The above table does not tell a complete story. It does not include such activities as lumbering, petroleum extraction, and cotton handling, which are very important to certain sections. The table does, however, show that since 1914 the Pacific Coast has made rapid progress. Reasons for her industrial gains are great natural resources, wonderful climate, and extension of transportation facilities. The Panama Canal affords cheap shipping facilities to the markets of the East, thus effectively erasing the mountain barrier. The Pacific States, whose population is the most rapidly



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growing in the country, have a wonderful industrial future. The farming sections of the country will probably remain primarily agricultural, as they should.

There is a real lesson in this shift of American industry to non-union sections. Every time that the people of these communities congratulate themselves on the steady growth of their industries, they should recall this lesson. Let them remember what happened when selfish labor leaders and short sighted politicians got the upper hand in New England. Wise labor leaders, as they wield the tremendous powers granted them thru the Wagner Act, will profit from New England's misfortune. They can use their own powers wisely for their own honor, for labor's benefit, and for the nation's good; or they can use their powers selfishly to the detriment of all.
