"Voices Crying in The Wilderness"

There are not as many people in New Mexico as there are in Pennsylvania. When, however, they are asked to decide by ballot whether they want their Constitution changed their decision is no less significant than that of the larger state. Pennsylvanians took a positive stand against altering their state Constitution to bring it into line with New Deal thought, and the press of the nation carried the story at some length. What about New Mexico.

Written in a homely, common sense style characteristic of country newspapers, an editorial in the Raton Range, a small daily of Raton, New Mexico, reveals that state's attitude unmistakably.

"Apparently the people of the state of New Mexico are fed up with legislation, especially any kind of law-making which event hints at costing anything extra.

"This thought is prompted by the returns of Tuesday's special election on amendments.

"Everyone of the proposed changes in the state constitution was defeated. And the vote cast was pitifully small.

"All of which indicates that, despite New Deal's New Programs, New anything, folks are not looking kindly upon the proposition of additional law-making.

"If this vote is any sort of forecast, we can expect little if any, consent on the part of the people to any further effort of 'monkeying' with the Constitution of the United States.

"You've all been reading lately in the press of the country considerable news and comment about the federal constitution. You've seen the organization of various clubs around the country for the purpose of preserving the Bible of American democracy. You've seen and heard also much comment about the constitution's being a document of horse and buggy days, and that it must be changed and speeded up to meet modern conditions.

"Of course, an amendment election in New Mexico is a far cry from a national issue on the national constitution. But at the same time it is a hint as regards the temper of the electorate at the present time.

"Evidently we can go so far and no further in this matter of laws and amendments. The finest thing about the whole business is the set-up requiring the vote of the public generally on such propositions as changing a constitution either state or national. Therein lies the safeguard of our democratic form of government.

Halloween Suggestions

With Halloween only a few days away the pumpkin and the squash are becoming more important in the winter's food supply. They are important, too, because they are usually inexpensive and yet are high in food value. Like most yellow vegetables they are good sources of Vitamin A, and it is this vitamin that helps to build resistance to infections, to maintain vitality and to stimulate growth.

Although pumpkin pie is doubtless the most popular pumpkin dish, pumpkin, like squash, may be baked or mashed and used as a vegetable. For mashed squash or pumpkin boil, or preferably steam the pieces, and when tender mash and season with butter, salt and pepper. A generous use of butter is the secret in preparing squash or pumpkin as delicious vegetable dishes.

A new and interesting way of serving Danish squash as a main dish is baking it in the shell, then halving it and serving with some creamed dish. It is prepared as follows:

Baked Danish Squash with Creamed Chicken

Wash Danish squash and bake in the oven until tender. Remove from oven and cut in half, lengthwise.

Public Speaking Pupils Practice with Telephone

Telephones are used to teach classes in public speaking by Arthur J. Petrimoux, instructor in a number of Catholic high schools in Detroit. Students are assigned in pairs to prepare their speeches, and when delivering their talk they stand, each with an unconnected telephone in his hand, at opposite sides of the room, and deliver their addresses to each other "over the telephone."

"Ridiculous though it may seem", declares the instructor, "such use of the instruments lends an atmosphere of reality to the conversations, to the end that self-consciousness is dispelled to a marked degree. Delivery of the speeches, which are original and along practical lines, assumes in many cases a naturalness and flexibility of tone which indicates that the student 'feels like himself.' Incidentally, the students also are taught the proper way to use the telephone effectively, the right distance to place the lips from the transmitter and the elements of 'telephone courtesy.'"

Mr. Petrimoux considers the idea of talking through unconnected telephones just as important as having students speak before mirrors, as is done by many public speaking instructors.

Meioly Barley Tried at Dufur

THE DALLIES — An experimental planting of Meioly barley on the E. E. Burtner farm at Dufur this year did not give particularly satisfactory results, Mr. Burtner reported to County Agent W. Wray Lawrence, with whom he cooperated in making the trial.

The barley grows too slow at the start, he reported, the straw is too short and the grain small, and does not weigh or yield with common Blue barley. He plans to try it one more year, however.

Scoop out seeds and remove skin (it comes off easily). Place a piece of butter in center of each squash and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Fill squash with creamed chicken. Creamed crab or other creamed fish or meat may be substituted.

For the Halloween party here is a delicious Spice Cake with a new flavor because of the pumpkin in it:

Halloween Spice Cake
1/2 cup butter
1 cup sugar
1 egg
1 cup mashed pumpkin
1/2 cup milk
2 c cake flour
1/2 tsp baking powder
2 tsp cinnamon
1/2 cup raisins
1 tsp cloves
1/2 tsp nutmeg
1/4 tsp salt
1/4 cup chopped nuts
Cream butter and gradually add sugar. Add egg and pumpkin and beat well. Sift dry ingredients together. Add alternately with milk to first mixture and fold in nuts and raisins. Bake in loaf in moderate oven about 50 minutes. Frost.

Pumpkin Corn Bread

1 1/2 cups mashed pumpkin
cooked or canned
1 1/2 cups milk
1 1/2 cups corn meal
2 eggs
6 tsp baking powder
1 1/2 to 2 tsp salt
3 tsp melted butter
1/2 cup flour

Mix the ingredients in order given. Pour the batter in greased baking pan and bake for 40 minutes in a hot oven. Cut in squares and serve hot with butter.
