Banks had two breaks in the very start of the game that gave them the ball on the Saints ten yard line. A fumbled punt gave the ball to Banks on the forty yard marker. From this point they were held in check and punted. On the first play St. Mary's fumbled and Banks recovered, but failed to capitalize and were held for downs. St. Mary's took the ball and in three plays gained the ninety yards and a touch down. First it was Hughes around right end for twenty yards; then Stassins on a reverse tore thru

the left side of a line for a forty yard gain. Then Prechiso dashed around right end for a score. Later on in the first half another touchdown was added and the score at the end of the first half was 13-0.

Chet Reynolds, playing left half for the Saints, gave a great exhibition of punting, passing and running and clearly showed that St. Mary's will have another great back as he is only a freshman and has three years more play.

Coach Day must be highly complimented on the work he has done with his team. Out of a light and inexperienced squad he has developed a flashy and speedy eleven that some day will give a good account of themselves and bring Banks High success on the gridiron.

The Saints will not have a game this week end but will rest after five weeks of play. Gervais, St. Vernonia, St. Mary's of Engene and Scappoose are left on the schedule.

State House Gossip

staffs of members, as much as newsmen, had difficulty in finding all the various committee rooms scattered through two buildings.

Things began to happen in rapid order the first day of the legislature and as a result the governor's message was delayed. It was not given on the initial day as has usually been the case as the house could not get organized in time and battled all day over the quality of two members or the filling of two seats—those of Robert Farrell and Glen O. Taylor.

But before the address was called off at two o'clock Monday afternoon, an unprecedented gesture was made and halted only by an opinion of the attorney general. It was decided that the governor be invited to address an informal joint session of the house and senate and call it unofficial. So it was started and the senate filed into the house and the galleries were filled.

A delay however resulted while the

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attorney general's opinion was sought. He ruled the assembly was not in session until both houses had organized and therefor the governor could not address the members officially while they sat unofficially. The party was over, the senate completed its organization and adjourned, and the house fought further on organization.

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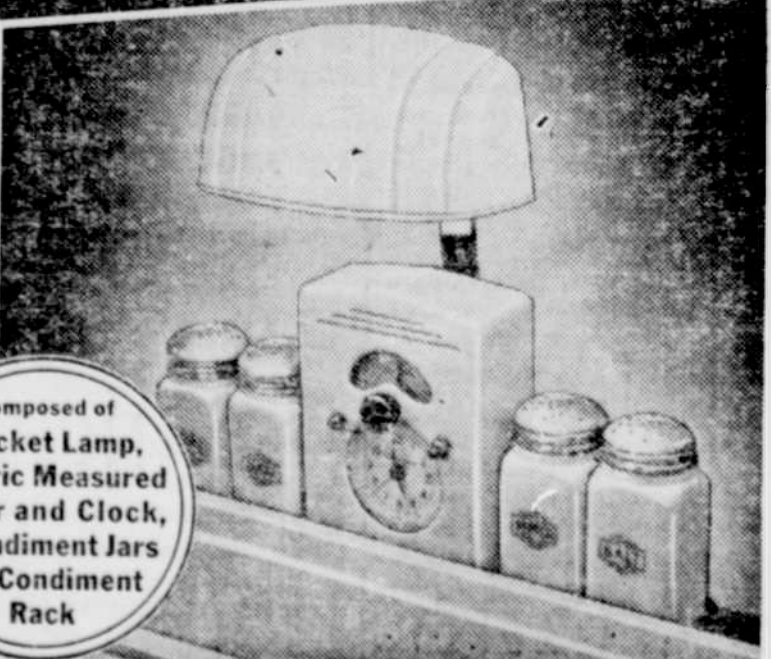
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
