Lack of Drivers Licenses Invoke \$5 Fines

A check on drivers licenses has been launched. Those without them will be fined \$5, in addition to the \$1 required by state law. The dead line for new licenses was set for July 1 of this year. The permit expires June 30, 1937.

County Relief Canneries Close Season Thursday

Relief canneries in Washington county completed their first season Thursday with a total pack of approximately 105,000 cans, valued at close to \$10,000, according to W. J. Mills assistant distributing officer. Approximately 550 Washington county families have been benefitted through the operation of the canneries, and many more will be aided through distribution during the winter months.

Holly Shipments to be Inspected Next Week

Inspection of Christmas holly will be made November 13, 14, and 15, according to C. A. Cunningham, state inspector. Those desiring to make shipments of holly, are asked to notify William Cyrus, county agent at Hillsboro. Holly stickers for the packages will be left with those whose plants are free of the small insect common to holly plants. Postal inspection will take place December 19 and 20.
