Lightning, Long a Puzzle, Now Under Man's Control

Primitive man reasoned that lightning was fire from Heaven. Fire was destructive, but it was also the greatest gift of the gods to man. It provided warmth, protected him from predatory animals and gave savor to his food. Lightning filled him with awe, for it also could produce destruction and was a manifestation of the giver of life and must be propitiated with sacrifices. Modern science, however, not only knows just what lightning really is, but knows how to handle it and control its great powers. Artificial lightning of millions of volts' power is now generated and so "tamed" that a man can be enveloped in the crashing, snapping, darting flames and emerge from the electrical fumes unharmed. Scientists also know how to measure the power of lightning. A single severe stroke probably lasts not more than 150 one-millionths of a second, the average current in the stroke during this time to pass this much charge to earth must be 100,000 amperes, or about the current required by 200,000 lamps. The maximum power in a severe stroke when it hits a conducting rod, such as a transmission line, is of the order of two billion kilowatts.—Montreal Herald.

Butter a Worth-While Year-Round Investment

Today we know that butter is a rich and palatable source of Vitamin A, and that it also contains some amounts of Vitamins D and E. It is Vitamin A that is necessary to the body for growth, for good physical vigor and for building general body resistance to infections, both in the child and adult. There is no question that a good well-balanced diet, with an abundance of Vitamin A has a favorable effect upon one's physical condition.

White butter has that "staying" quality desirable in food fat, it is still quickly and easily digested. Furthermore, dishes prepared with butter invite most favorable conditions of digestion because of their unusual taste-appealing flavor.

Some recipes that are just a bit better because they require butter are:
Orange Gingerbread
 1 cup molasses
 (if strong use 1-3 cup milk syrup and 2-3 cup molasses)
 1/2 cup boiling water
 1/2 cup melted butter
 2 cups flour
 2 tsp soda
 1/2 tsp ginger
 1/2 tsp cinnamon
 1 large orange (juice and grated rind)

Beat egg and add molasses. Add alternately the sifted dry ingredients with the boiling water and beat until smooth. Add melted butter, orange juice and rind and mix well. This makes a thin mixture. Bake slowly in a moderate oven 325 F. Serve warm with whipped cream. Serves 12.

Baked Carrots
 Select carrots that are uniform in size. Wash well and leave in their jackets. Arrange in a well-buttered glass baking dish, dot generously with butter and season. Bake in a hot oven until done. You may serve lemon butter sauce with them, which is made by melting 3 tbs of butter to 1 tbs of lemon juice. Pour sauce over baked carrots just before serving.

Honey Butter
 1/2 cup butter
 1 cup Honey
 Let butter stand at room temperature to soften. Mix with honey, stirring well. Put mixture in small jar, cover tightly and keep in refrigerator. Honey Butter tastes ever so good served with hot biscuits, cornbread or other hot breads.

Grapefruit Appetizer
 Cut grapefruit in halves and remove center and seeds. Cut the fruit from the skin with a sharp knife. Add a tsp of butter and one of sugar to each center. Broil in hot oven until fruit turns a light golden brown.

Interest Shown in New Wheat

BEND—Deschutes county farmers are showing considerable interest in a trial planting of 5.3 acres of Hybrid 63 winter wheat grown on the farm of M. A. King of Redmond this past year and which yielded at the rate of 50 bushels to the acre, reports G. Y. Haglund, county agent. The wheat grown by Mr. King was obtained from the Burns Experiment station for demonstration purposes. Some 20 farmers of the county are planning on planting this variety this fall for harvest in 1936.

Truck Men Ask for Certification

ONTARIO—Interest of some growers in obtaining certification of various truck crops, principally carrots and onions, is reported by R. G. Larson, Malheur county agent. As a preliminary step, Mr. Larson says, the onion crop belonging to Joe Luft of Vale has been inspected for certification for seed crop next year. These onions are being held in storage and will be planted next spring to grow seed.
