Diversification does not simply apply to a division of capital between stocks and bonds. It means the spreading of funds over different grades of securities. A bond list should contain second-grade as well as gilt-edge issues, while a stock list should contain a few outright speculations as well as sound dividendpaying issues. Diversification should also extend to the type of industry. Investors should never load up on oils or utilities but should spread their funds over many industries. geographically. Investments should not be concentrated in one locality
