mainly the result of our foolish Silver
Purchase program. We boosted
the price of silver (the monetary
standard) and thus automatically
brought on a serious deflation of prices
and business. Japanese military
aggression and industrial com-
petition have also contributed to
China's current problems.

ARGENTINA'S drought last year
raised havoc with her cheap crops
wheat and linseed but it also contrib-
uted to the price increase of these
crops. Under the forced draft of
high protective tariffs, Argentine in-
dustry has made good progress in
the last twelve months.

BRAZIL'S coffee industry is con-
tinuing to improve. Her chief dif-
ficulty arises from the shortage of
foreign exchange. Brazil's high-
light of 1935 was a tremendous in-
crease in her cotton crop and ship-
ments—thanks to the obliging cur-
tailments of our own cotton crop!

CHILE continued the recovery
which has been going on in most
Latin-American countries for the
past three years. Shipments of her
principal products—nitrate and cop-
per—made good gains during the
year. Chile's big problem, like that
of all Latin-American countries, ex-
cept Argentina, is inability to bal-
ance the public budget.

SUMMARY: Just as in the United
States where business is 8 per cent
above last March, most nations show
good gains over a year ago. In fact,
in a few cases 1935 was the best year
since the World War. On the other
hand, this improvement is largely
the result of heavier public borrow-
ings when the national debt really
should continue to improve for
a few more years. Eventually, how-
