To Peter Jungers and Isabel Jun-
gers:

In the name of the State of Ore-
gon, you are hereby required to ap-
pear and answer the complaint
filed against you in the above en-
titled suit within four weeks from
the date of the first publication of
this summons; and if you fail so to
appear and answer or otherwise ap-
pear herein, for want thereof, plain-
tiffs will apply to the above named
courts for the relief prayed for in
their complaint, to-wit:

1st. That the defendants Peter Jun-
gers and Isabel Jungers be required
forthwith to pay, satisfy and dis-
charge all taxes lawfully levied
and assessed against the South one-
half of said Tract Nineteen (19) in

Wilshire, Washington County, State
of Oregon, which taxes are now due
and payable.

2nd. That the defendants Jun-
gers be required forthwith to pay to
plaintiffs herein all the monthly in-
stallments being Ten Dollars (\$10.00)
per month beginning on the first
day of November, 1935, and contin-
uing to the first day of the calendar
month in which said decree may be
rendered and which said install-
ments may then have matured.

3rd. That the defendants be re-
quired forthwith to pay to the plain-
tiffs Williamson the sum of Thirty
Dollars (\$30.00) for necessary re-
pairs made upon the roof of the said
dwelling house on said real property
together with the sum of \$14.40 fire-
insurance premiums paid by the said

premises insured against loss by fire.
