400 to Get Degrees at OSC Graduation June 1

Corvallis, May 22—Approximately
400 men and women will receive de-
grees at the sixty-seventh annual
commencement at Oregon State col-
lege Monday, June 1, when the tra-
ditional rites and ceremonies will be
carried out on the campus.
Commencement this year is on the
same day at both the state college
and state university campuses, the
former being in the forenoon and the
latter in the evening. Chancellor
Frederick M. Hunter will take part
in both ceremonies, and at the state
college Chancellor Emeritus William
Jasper Kerr will participate in the
commencement there for the twenty-
eighth consecutive year.
