BABSON SAYS

Continued from Page 1

WHEAT AND COPPER

Heading the list of these fundamen-
tal factors is the Law of Supply and
Demand. After centuries of trying
to find a substitute, this old natural
law still reigns supreme. We can
have no more vivid illustration of the
futility of trying to get around it than
the story of our cereal markets since
1934. Two years ago our carry-over
of wheat was practically equal to one
whole year's supply. Since then three
short crops have virtually wiped out
this surplus. Prices have trebled and
are still headed higher. The same
situation is true in the case of many
other farm products such as corn,
oats, and cotton and allied com-
modities which move in sympathy
with them. Radically reduced sup-
plies of agricultural products killed
the AAA farm program.

At the same time, stronger demand
has done away with the necessity for
certain industrial commodity agree-
ments. During the depression, world
copper producers tried desperately to
control the output and price of their
commodity. However, as the bot-
tom fell out of business during 1931
and 1932, prices melted below the cost
of production. With the sharp recov-
ery since 1933—69 per cent according
to the Babsonchart—an increased de-
mand has taken care of bothersome
copper surpluses and trebled quotat-
ions. The 1936 political campaign
can not out-mode such an age-old eco-
nomic force as the Law of Supply and
Demand any more than the AAA or
copper proration could.

FEARS RISING LIVING COSTS

While the election will probably
unsettle conditions from time to
time, I am sure it can not now stop
the rushing tide of business. Read-
ers know that I am bullish on the
long-term outlook for business who-
ever is elected in November. In ev-
ery recovery period commodity
prices have advanced sympathet-
ically although they have moved
faster in some cycles than in others.
