stockholders—more alert, active, res-
ponsible stockholders. It is not a
lack of intelligence.

Investors have plenty of brains if
they would only use them. They are
smart enough in their chosen occupa-
tions. But when it comes to intelli-
gent use of proxies, both intellect and
energy are all gone. If the small in-
vestor's own private fortunes were
the only thing at stake, I would be
less disturbed. This matter, how-
ever, has gone beyond the personal
prosperity of any one individual or
group.

Our country depends, for bread and
butter, on business. The very lives
and homes of our people have become
incorporated. Shall they be left wholly
at the mercy of self-seeking politi-
cians and lazy executives? Or will
the real masters, the multitudes of
small stockholders, come out of their
comas, quite their futile scoldings and

terest thereon at the rate of 10 per

sum of \$400.00 attorney's fees, and for
her costs and disbursements herein

be declared a first and subsisting lien

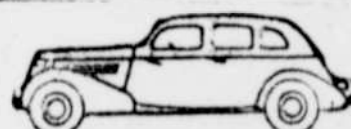
