Fresh Peaches in Season

Thoroughly enjoy fresh peaches while they are on the market. The season isn't long and with the many and varied ways of serving them, there is little excuse for not serving them daily. On at least two occasions try the recipes listed below.

Fresh Peach Tapioca 1/2 cup quick-cooking tapioca 3 cups water 1 cup sugar 1/2 tsp salt 1 tsp lemon juice 2 cups sliced fresh peaches 1 tsp butter Cook the tapioca and water in a double boiler for 15 minutes, add the sugar, butter, salt and lemon juice. In a greased baking dish, make alternate layers of the tapioca and peaches with a layer of the peaches on top. Bake in a moderate oven until the peaches are tender or until lightly browned on top. Serve either hot or cold with rich cream.

Fresh Peach Mousse 6 medium-sized peaches 1/2 to 1/3 cup sugar 1/4 tsp vanilla 2 tsp cold water 1 tsp lemon juice 1 cup whipping cream 2 tsp gelatin Choose well-ripened peaches. Peel, seed and press through a sieve; there should be 1 1/2 cups puree. Add sugar, the amount depending on tartness of peaches. Soak gelatin 5 minutes in cold water; then stand over hot water until dissolved. Add to peaches and stir thoroughly. Chill until syrupy. Add vanilla and lemon juice, whip cream until stiff and fold thoroughly into peach mixture. Turn into freezing tray and freeze. Yield: 5 servings.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

To remove grass stains from clothing rub with lard and soak in cold water. Steamed rice makes an attractive border to the platter of creamed chicken.

When cleaning silver, fill an aluminum kettle half full of water, enough chipped soap to make a light suds. 1 tablespoon baking soda and 1 teaspoon salt, add the silver pieces and boil for about five minutes. Remove silver to a clear hot water rinsing bath and dry with a soft cloth. It can be polished with your silver cloth or chamois.

Juices for jelly making are definitely acid in flavor. If acid seems lacking, a good precaution is to add 1 tablespoon of strained lemon juice to each standard measuring cup of fruit juice, say home economics specialists at O. S. C. This facilitates jellifying to some extent and adds to flavor. A mimeographed leaflet, HE 498, entitled "Fruit Jellies, Preserves, Jams, Marmalades, Conservas and Butters" is available for free distribution from the college at Corvallis or from county home demonstration agents.

SALAD-OF-THE-WEEK By Elsie Stark



EXTRA! Extra! Summer is almost at hand. . . We know it by the birds and flowers and the gayer, light clothes. . . And by the fact that molded salads are beginning to appear on the table several times a week. Here is a popular salad that belongs in your current recipe file:

Celery and Cabbage Mold 2 tablespoons gelatin 1/2 cup cold water 1/2 cup boiling water 1/4 cup vinegar 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 cup celery, finely diced 1/2 cup cabbage, finely shredded 1/4 cup Relish Spread Real mayonnaise Soften gelatin in cold water. Add boiling water and dissolve. Chill. When slightly thickened, add vinegar and salt. Add chilled celery and cabbage, and relish spread. Turn into mold. Chill until firm. Unmold on crisp lettuce. Garnish with real mayonnaise. Serves 6.
