Your Eyes and Mine

THE PIN HOLE TEST
 By Dr. Emery C. Ingham

The use of the pin hole test for defective vision is quite interesting and may be made at home. All that you need for the experiment is an ordinary calling card, a pin and some one with defective eyesight.

Make a small hole in the center of the card with a pin, being careful to push the pin clear through to make a clean clear hole without fuzzy edges. Now on a calendar or series of letters (a test chart if you have one) test your vision without glasses. Then holding the pin hole close to the eye, observe the same letters from the same distance. Seeing thru the pin hole should clear the letters of any fuzzy edges, make the letters clear and black and if you are near sighted, enable you to see letters that you could not see before.

The pin hole clears the distant vision in the case of simple eye trouble, but will not materially effect eyes with serious structural defects. The use of the pin hole for the improvement of defective eyesight is not new, as it was used by the Greeks and early Egyptians hundreds of years before Christ. The American Indians used the same principle to enable him to see great distances, especially on a hot day. When he wished to clear his vision he would close his hand, place his eye close to his fore finger and thumb, and peek thru a small hole the size of which he regulated by the tightening of his bended fingers. A hunter uses the same principle in the use of the peep sight on the modern guns.

Try the pin hole test for your eye sight. If your vision improves thru pin hole, it is possible to improve your eye sight by exercise. If your vision does not improve with the use of the pin hole then it is likely you have a serious eye defect and should consult a physician before taking a great number of exercises for the eyes.
