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CONGRATULATIONS TO THE PRESIDENT

"The nation has spoken. Every American will accept the verdict, and work for the common cause for the good of the country. That is the spirit of democracy."

So ran the telegram dispatched by Governor Landon to President Roosevelt when it became apparent that the voters had rallied in unprecedented numbers in support of the Administration. And that telegram represents something more than good sportsmanship—it marks an attitude that should be held by all of the people in every walk of life.

The Democratic victory was not a party victory. No mere party victory could be so overwhelming or so completely break down sectional lines of partisan sympathy.

The victory was a very different thing—it was a personal victory for Mr. Roosevelt. No man in a century has so captivated the imagination and emotions of the people, and none has received so great an expression of public confidence.

A Republican newspaper said the morning following the election that "the President today is the most popular figure our nation has known since Washington." It is impossible to gain that. The most popular of presidents, and those whose Administrations stand out mountainously in our history—Jefferson, Lincoln, Cleveland—were never so popular as Mr. Roosevelt. The past records have all been shattered.

The time for partisanship has passed. And the time for co-operation has come. This does not mean that the President should be followed blindly in every course—that would be unjust to Mr. Roosevelt himself as well as to the country. It does mean that all should work together in the common cause, as Governor Landon said deliberating differences and adjusting varying points of view to the end that the great ideal of democratic government be served to the ultimate of all our capabilities.

Congratulations to the President! Few men in the world's history have been so signally honored by a great people—an honor which carries with it the gravest responsibilities. Every good citizen will hope sincerely that Mr. Roosevelt's second term as Chief Executive of the foremost nation on earth will be successful, and that his will be a high place in the history of our time.

Must Go Back to Cell

Fort Sill, Okla.—Carlton B. Chilton of Cleveland, who escaped from the Granite, Okla., reformatory twenty-three years ago, must return to Oklahoma to finish a two-year sentence for bank theft, Governor Marland stated.

The decision was announced after a two and one-half-hour hearing at which the Governor received a report on Chilton's case from Colonel Charles Daley, superintendent of the state crime bureau. The superintendent urged that Chilton, now a respected citizen, be permitted to remain in Ohio.

Governor Marland said in a statement, however, that he had "come to the conclusion that it would be destructive to prison discipline if the man is not extradited."

Chilton was serving a two-year sentence for stealing \$400 from a Calvin, Okla., bank, when he escaped.
