TUNE IN ON KWJJ at 9 every evening, (except Monday-Saturday and at 2:30 Sunday afternoon.

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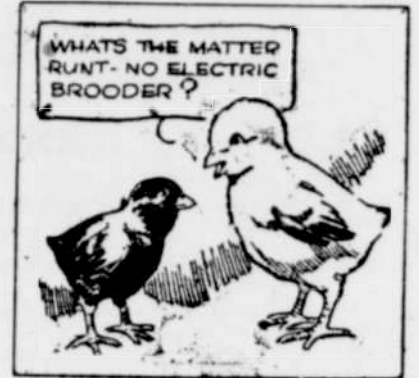
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
