lower, and hours gradually cut shorter. There is, however, one dark spot in the outlook for American living standards—that is waste. Billions of dollars are squandered every year in the United States. I estimate that accidents, fires, worthless products, useless competition failures, sickness, and the like eat up \$25,000,000,000 annually. To this terrific destruction must now be added the new item of government extravagance. Living standards are advanced through improvement in production methods which result in multiplying wealth or increasing our annual "goods income." Bureaucracy, shoveling dirt from one pile to another these do not create wealth or produce goods. They destroy our wealth and dissipate our national income. Ten years ago they constituted less than five per cent. This constantly rising cost of government is a perpetual reminder that money inflation lurks in the offing. The major result of inflation would be the sharp upping of living costs. The "goods income" of wage and salary workers would automatically be ripped to shreds. Total living costs are today only twenty per cent above the 1933 low but they are definitely on the up. Trade competition from countries with low-paid labor is also a menace to our own existence.

Thus far I have been speaking of living standards in terms of the nation as a whole. In Germany or Italy and other regimented nations the national outlook is the outlook for the individual. The United States and Canada, however, are among the few nations in the world where the individual can better the national living standard. America is still the land of opportunity. The best way to lift your own future living standards above average is to manage your present income wisely. Personal budgeting is one method. Methodical management, wise and thrifty saving will bring better living standards than blowing your weekly wage or monthly salary on useless frills. Remember the old adage: "Income \$1, expense 95 cents, result happiness; but the income \$1, expense \$1.05, result misery." 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YOUR EYES AND MINE

Of the more serious diseases of the eye glaucoma is probably the most common and the most feared. Glaucoma is a peculiar condition of the eye in which the circulation of the eye is disturbed in such a manner that there develops a pressure within the eye. This pressure becomes so intense that the optical nerve in the back of the eye is pushed backward and the delicate nerves leading from the eye are broken.

Glaucoma may often be mistaken for iritis or simple inflammation of the eye but this must be guarded against as the diseases of the eye are entirely different. In iritis the infection is usually confined to the anterior portion of the eyeball which becomes red and inflamed and quite sensitive to light. In glaucoma the more serious effect of the eye is in the back part of the eye ball, at the point where the optic nerve leaves the eye, and the destruction of these nerves at this point.

In iritis the cornea is quite sensitive to the touch and pains greatly with any change of temperature, while in glaucoma the eye ball is usually anesthetic having little or no feeling of pain upon pressure, tho in feeling of the eyeball the great increase of tension is readily noticed, as the eye ball feels hard and marble like. This hardness is due to the great pressure created by the disturbing circulation.

In iritis the tension of the eyeball is increased also but not as much as in glaucoma nor is it continued over such a long period. In iritis the maximum pressure is reached at the height of the disease which is of relatively short duration and with glaucoma the tension continues over a long period of time as glaucoma is a chronic disease.

The treatment of glaucoma and iritis is entirely different and for this reason it is necessary to know definitely what type of disease is present. The best advice is to see your physician for a definite diagnosis, tho in future articles I will attempt to give you a satisfactory treatment for both diseases.
