Four school patrons in the Deer lick and eleven patrons in the Scoggins district voted unanimously Tuesday on a proposal to merge the former district with that of Scoggins, cording to O. B. Kraus school superintendent.

The merger will give the combined district a total assessed valuation of more than \$800,000 which is expected to bring the construction of a new school building, with combined gymnasium and auditorium at a very nominal increase in the tax levy if cost is spread over a period of years further states the official.

There were no directors or clerk of the Deerlick district so the election was held by Superintendent Kraus, who declared to the best of his knowledge such a consolidation is the first of its kind in the county.

almost unanimously retorted: "Then why not change the prevailing economic system? If you cannot worship both God and Mammon under the present economic system of industrialism, capitalism, and nationalism you can at least take sides with those who are trying to change the system."

Spiritual Revival Necessary
It, of course, is true that our churches must cease being only social clubs and we laymen must be known by a stronger character and good works. Young people and all other people must realize, however, that men cannot be reformed by mere legislation or even education. The American Magazine does not even realize this, as shown by their recent article on the subject.

We must be "born-again". The hearts of people must be changed in order for any social or other system to succeed. This is a spiritual problem. Here is where America again needs the churches, Bible prayers, Sunday observances, Bible study and the Ten Commandments. Therefore, when we criticize the Church and note how it is declining in behaviour and influence we must not forget that the world still needs it. The Church continues to be the basic agency through which civilization will be saved. The world is still ruled by feelings rather than by figures.

Mr. and Mrs. M. Hickox left the first of the week for a visit with relatives in California.


