WHAT DO YOU THINK

Just suppose it should be announced from Washington that the next session of Congress would devote itself to studying ways and means to reduce the present extravagant cost of government;

That it would adjust reduce or eliminate special, punitive or class taxation that now hampers or discourages business—such as the capital gains and losses clause and the tax on corporation surpluses;

That it would adopt a strong and definite policy that would protect the rights of the worker, as well as the rights of a factory owner and the public;

That it would use all powers of the government to see that workmen or employees, union or non-union, were protected in their jobs and operations, and that infringers on their rights would suffer the full penalties of law enforcement;

That it would discontinue its present program of duplicating existing power facilities and the expenditures of hundreds of millions of dollars to provide an unnecessary competitive service against a private industry whose rates are already subject to stringent public regulation;

That it would study the rail transportation system from the standpoint of encouraging, rather than hamstringing the American railroads as is now being done insidiously by those who would socialize the carriers under government ownership.

Just suppose our government would announce such a program instead of coming forth with new and untried experiments threatening to property rights, personal liberties investments and unemployment.

Do you think business would pick up in this country, money start to flow into new enterprises, and new jobs be created? Think it over.

The United States news has compiled the record of the last 3 congresses in enacting major laws. It shows that the legislators are nowhere near as eager as they used to be to put new laws on the books.

The 73rd Congress (1933-34) passed 27 new major laws, including the NRA, AAA, TVA, SEC, and 4 important monetary acts. The 74th Congress (1935-36) passed 19 major laws, including the social security act, a revision of banking legislation, the National Labor Relations Act, and 4 farm aid acts.

The last session passed but 6 major laws. And some of these—such as the laws to plug loop holes in the income tax—were practically supported.

West Hills Memorial Park Adds to Beauty of the Tualatin Valley

Recently it was the writers privilege to be escorted through the grounds of the West Hills Memorial Park on the Canyon road at West Hills, just west of Sylvan.

A Garden of Memories is truly an adequate phrase for the beautiful park. High, rolling land lends itself exceptionally well to the many landscape improvements. The writer found a beautiful garden like burial park, as unlike the old style cemetery as daylight is unlike darkness, with smooth permanent drive-ways flanked by colorful landscaping effects broad expanses of green carpetlike lawns, beautiful shrubs and flowers Nature's own expression of life.

It was pointed out to me, by the management, that one finds only markers identifying each grave set level with the grass, so that they do not break the green vistas of lawn and trees. The markers are of bronze and are of ample size to carry name, dates and any other inscription desired.

The purchase of a lot in West Hills Memorial Park does not mean the purchase of so many square feet of

ground. It means more than that. It means that through the years, men will be employed to care for every lot and grave, and that each lot and each grave will be kept beautiful always, without additional cost to the lot owners.

One of the many new improvements the writer found was the large artificial lake. Large rockeries have also been constructed along the north bank of the lake. An item of beauty about this artificial lake is a spouting fountain in the center.

Will be Added Asset

Taken all in all the lake with its proposed setting of trees, shrubs and landscaping will truly be an added asset to the already beautiful park grounds. Water for the lake will be supplied from the company's well.

The placing of trees and shrubs around the building will be done at the same time the lake planting is done and should be considered in formulating your suggestions.
