Farm Debt Adjustment Services Available to All County Farmers

Farm Debt Adjustment services are
available to all Washington County
farmers threatened by foreclosure or
faced by obligations beyond the cap-
acity of the farm to pay, announces
the Farm Security Administration,
USDA. Application for this service
may be made either through the
county rehabilitation supervisor's of-
fice at Hillsboro, or by writing the
district supervisor, Farm Debt Ad-
justment FSA, Portland.
Adjustments such as time exten-
sion, refinancing and principal reduc-
tions enabling the farmer to continue
his occupancy and pay his debt are
effected through friendly and confi-
dential negotiations between debtor
and creditor. Services of debt ad-
justment workers are entirely advo-
catory and in no way compulsory.
While farm foreclosures have de-
creased in Oregon in recent years,
many farmers are still handicapped
with debts beyond the capacity of the
farm to pay. As both the creditor
and debtor lose through foreclosure,
every effort is made to bring about
adjustments whereby the debt may
be paid in full and still leave enough
income to provide an adequate living
for the family.

Farmers in need of the service are
urged to make application for ad-
visory aid before foreclosure pro-
ceedings have been instituted. If pos-
sible—Creditors are equally welcome
in applying for debt adjustment ser-
vices where it is possible to work out
a satisfactory solution to avoid the
expense of foreclosure proceedings.
