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## MEN MUST WORK

If single men 30 years old or less of sound mind and body, cannot support themselves in days like these it is worth an effort to find out why. The depression emergency is over. Except for strikes, factories are operating at near-record production. The cry for more help on the farms has been heard for months. If any able-bodied man, not more than 30 years old, cannot manage to feed, clothe, and shelter himself under such conditions, then the taxpayers, out of whose pockets come the relief funds, are entitled to know why.

America was built by men and women who managed for themselves. If it is to continue to be the kind of country in which we all can take pride, the job must be done by those who dig for themselves and make a go of it despite the difficulties. The average citizen feels the time is ripe for a showdown in the relief set-up in this country. He doesn't want to see any worthy person suffer. But he has grown tired of helping to support those who, in thousands of cases should now be able to support themselves. "Rid the relief rolls of able bodied men" is about to become a national slogan.—Rigby Star.

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## YOU CAN'T GET AWAY WITH EXTREMES

Stagnation of business, stagnation of building and real estate, stagnation of the stock market, no new enterprises being launched; all this is believed by competent authorities to be largely due to the curse of inequitable and excessive taxation.

Commenting on the viciously drastic characteristics of the capital gains and undistributed profits tax, Morris S. Tremaine, controller of the State of New York under President Roosevelt when he was governor, and still serving in that capacity, recently said: "There's only one real virtue and that's moderation. You can't get away with extremes. The Boston Tea Party was not about tea, but about extreme taxation."

And, referring to the recent slump in the stock market, he said: "It's operations are so curtailed that it is not paying its share of the taxes. New York transfer tax returns from Wall Street for June, July and August fell 27 1/2 per cent from the totals of the same period last year." The stock market is at its lowest level in sixty years, in relation to national income.

Mr. Tremaine feels that this condition is due largely to high Federal taxes. "People won't move their investments," he declared, "because they won't pay the heavy taxes." In the past, a Federal policy of reasonable taxation yielded ten times more revenue than the present "soak the rich" policy.

Thanks to excessive taxation, regulation and political "investigations," it is now virtually impossible for business to function on a normal basis, and the odds against creating new and successful productive enterprises are discouraging. Will it take another Boston Tea Party to correct the tax situation?

A short time ago this column commented on the belle f of a number of Washington writers that the New Deal is tempering its course, and is being steered in a more conservative direction. Recent events add authority to that view.

The President is talking of budget-balancing, and there has been a cut-down in Federal activities, notably in the relief field. And the sentiment of Congressmen, who are worried by the stock collapse, is generally in favor of taking a cautious line.

A continuance of this trend could do as much as anything to encourage business.
