TOO MANY TAXES

In discussing proposals by which Congress might revise the undistributed profits tax law downwards the fact must not be overlooked that this measure was rejected by the Senate after it had bogged down under the weight of common-sense and logic in the debates. Afterwards it crawled through the two branches of Congress as part of a series of experimental compromises.

The principle represents a seed of sense that has grown a harmful crop of higher living costs. The increases have fallen hardest on the common people. Living costs have advanced 29 per cent, and more, in the past three years. Rents have gone even higher. You could buy a ten cent package of cigarettes for a nickel but for the tax; fifteen cents worth of gas for your car for a dime; fifty cents worth of choice meat for two-thirds the price and your luxuries and necessities would be far below the present market prices except for hidden taxes. Increase in prices occur with every fresh tax spree. Thus the complications and problems of life have become more complicated by more taxes.

The growth and expansion of our national industries is due to technological advancement, which means mechanical and scientific progress—called "Yankee inventions" by Europe a half century ago. The Yankee slogan used to run: "The farmer pays the tax." Now, it's "my friends and fellow citizens," one and all. When your tears flow and your heartaches for the "ill-nourished, ill-clad and ill-housed" don't lose your head and be carried away with sob-stuff to prove that remedies for national ills exist in class legislation. The poorer you are the more every tax boost affects your interests. Only the rich man can ward off the blows.

The real danger which confronts us—and it is a serious one—is the danger of civil strife of revolution, because of failure of the Roosevelt administration to protect the worker in his job to protect the home owner and factory in his right to peacefully occupy his own property; because of failure of the Federal Government to protect either "property rights" or "human rights."

It is not the intervention on the part of the President that is so much needed. It is the performance of his duty to enforce the provisions of the Constitution which guarantee the rights of the citizen; the performance of his duty to enforce the laws we already have.

 For centuries hundreds of different experiments and programs have been tried over there and—like the above—later revealed. The worker's only real protection, whether he be German, British, Canadian, or American, lies in greater production and lower prices.

"New Deal" Old Stuff
 A study of history shows that England has had ten violent "New Deal" periods. There is nothing in the Roosevelt program of today which has not been tried in England, France and Germany. Some of this legislation, such as Stock Exchange Regulation and Old Age Unemployment Insurance, has stuck; but all previous attempts to regulate prices and wages have failed and been repealed.

Today, Parliament is interested in increasing the birth rate, improving the health of workers, eliminating slums, and reducing the cost of living. I repeat, all our New Deal legislation, which gives Wall Street such jitters, is "old stuff" to English and Continental investors. They do not fear it. Even labor leaders are skeptical of it as an aid to them.

These leaders say: "The working people of America have secured a much higher standard of living without restrictions and legislation. They are foolish to get tied down by labor unions and let the inefficient workers set the pay standards for the entire group." The average weekly income of workers of the United States is within two per cent of the high of 1929 while the cost of living is from

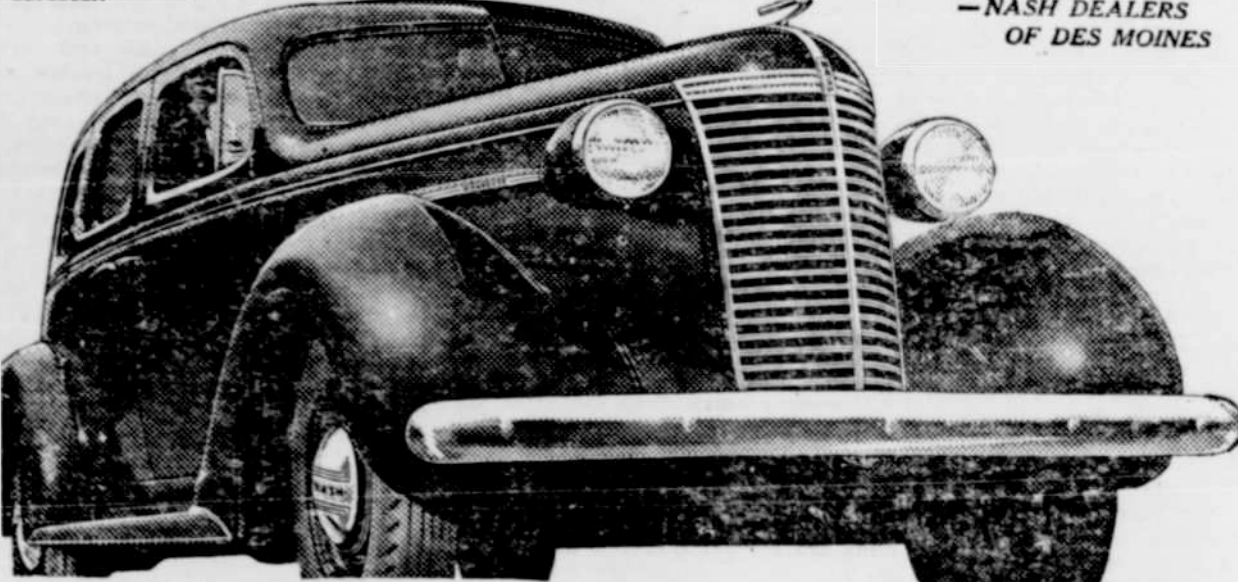

Europe Likes New Deal

Yes, America has a motor vehicle to every five persons while England has one car to every 20 individuals; and we have an electric refrigerator to every three families in comparison with one to every 20 British families. Let me emphasize that the manufacturers and big employers of England and Europe are all for Roosevelt and his experiments. They believe that our new deal will so increase manufacturing

ing costs in America that it will be easier for their goods to jump our tariff walls and undersell our products in our markets.
