Tulip Tree Useful for

Furnishings, Novelties

The tulip tree (Liriodendron Tu-
lipifera, Linnaeus), also called yel-
low poplar, and whitewood, is one of
the most distinctive of American
trees, notes a writer in the Indian-
apolis News. The leaves are simple
alternate, usually four-lobed, four to
six inches across, appear to have
tips cut off at right angle to the
stem, and are long-stalked. At the
base of each leaf-stalk are two leaf
appendages. The flowers are tulip-
like, one and one-half to two inches
deep, greenish yellow with three re-
flexed sepals and six petals. The
fruit is made up of long-winged nut-
lets arranged in light brown, cone-
like clusters two and one-half to
three inches long. The bark when
young is smooth, bitter, ash-gray to
brown, mottled with light blotches.
On old trunks it becomes thick
brown, deeply furrowed. The twigs
are smooth, shiny, stout, reddish-
brown marked with pale obscure
breathing pores. Complete rings of
stipule-scars surround the twigs.
The buds are smooth, flattened, one-
fourth to one-half an inch long,
blunt-pointed, reddish-brown, and
covered with one pair of bud-scales.
Within the buds are small leaves.
The wood is soft, not strong, light,
white-yellowish to brownish, and
works easily. It is used for furni-
ture interior finishings, wooden-
ware, novelties and veneer.

The tulip tree is found from Rhode
Island to Michigan, south to Florida
and Arkansas. It frequently reaches
a height of 100 feet and a diameter
of 5 feet.

Wheat Drill a Product

of Professor's Ingenuity
Long before the Revolution, Col-
onial farmers knew about a "won-
derful" drilling machine which
could be used for planting certain
crops. Just how successfully it op-
erated the records do not state, but
Elliot, in his "Fifth Essay on Field
Husbandry," published in 1754, says:
"Mr. Tull's Wheat Drill is a Won-
derful Invention, but it being the
first invented of its kind, no wonder
if it be intricate, as indeed it is, and
consists of more wheels and other
parts than there is really any need
of. This I was very sensible of all
along, but knew not how to mend
it. Therefore I applied myself to
the Reverend Mr. Clap, President
of Yale College, and desired him
for the regard he had for the Pub-
lic and to me that he would apply
his mathematical learning and
Mechanical Genius in that Affair;
which he did to so good Purpose
that this new modeled Drill can
be made for the fourth part of what
Mr. Tull's will cost."

The Name Hermine

The name Hermine, Hermine or
Hermnia is of uncertain origin; or
rather, it may have two origins,
its meaning depending upon which
is chosen. It may be the feminine
of the Latin Herminius, meaning
"lordly," which would account for
the meaning "autocratic" some-
times given it. Or it may be the
feminine of the Teutonic Herman,
which has two meanings, "popular"
and "warrior." Hermione of Greek
origin and meaning "Maid of high
degree," may be a variant of Her-
minia. St. Hermione, second cen-
tury, was well versed in medicine
and attended the sick. The Greek
Hermione, daughter of Menelaus
and Helen, was extremely beautiful.

Life in New Zealand

One of the healthiest countries in
the world is New Zealand, despite
its varied climate. The north island
has volcanoes, tropical areas, hot
water springs, while the south is-
land boasts of glaciers, mountains
perpetually capped with snow. New
Zealand natives, the Maoris, de-
scend from Polynesians, who
canoeed thousands of miles to reach
the islands in the fourteenth cen-
tury. Christchurch, the town, was
founded by a "select" group of set-
tlers known as "Canterbury Pil-
grims," is an agricultural center.

"Rose of Jericho" Plant

Native of Sandy Deserts

The rose of Jericho or Resurrec-
tion plant is not mentioned in the
Bible, though one of the books of the
Apocrypha speaks of the "rose-plant
in Jericho." The Standard Bible dic-
tionary says this may possibly be
the real rose, which was first intro-
duced in Palestine probably during the
Persian or Greek era, but the
Syriac translation reads instead the
Oleander.

What is called today "rose of
Jericho" is a very homely crucifer,
an Anastatica hierochuntina, says a
writer in the Detroit News, which
in a moist atmosphere opens the
petals of its corona and in a dry
atmosphere closes them. This plant
is a native of the sandy deserts
from Arabia and Syria to Algeria,
is an annual and grows about six
inches high. Soon after flowering
the leaves fall off and the branches
roll up into a ball that looks like
wickerwork, and that contains the
seeds or fruit. The plants are up-
rooted by the wind and blown over
the desert. When the rains descend,
the branches open back and the
seeds germinate. There are other
species of plants known also as res-
urrection plants because of this fac-
ulty of "coming to life" when the
dried leaves, branches or fruits are
moistened.

Washington's Birth Date

George Washington was born on
what was then, in England and her
colonies, February 11, 1732, and un-
til he was twenty he observed his
birthday on that date. But in 1752
England adopted, by act of parlia-
ment, the Gregorian calendar in
place of the Julian. The latter no
longer represented the true astro-
nomical year, it being at that time
eleven days behind. The act or-
dered that this difference be struck
from the calendar and that the day
following September 2, 1752, be re-
garded as the fourteenth of the
month. Thereafter, what had been
February 11 became February 22.

Meaning of Motet in Music

The term motet was defined by
Walter Odington about 1225 as short
movement in song. The older motet
is a vocal composition written for
several (usually three) voices, of
which the tenor was assigned a mo-
tive or part of a Gregorian chorale.
The text is biblical. The masters of
the motet form were Orlando di
Lasso, Palestrina and Bach, who
also is responsible for the insertion
of the chorale into the motet. The
motet is unaccompanied.

Mexico's Mining Country

In early colonial times the mining
country of the west coast of Mexico
stretched from the Gila river in
Arizona, across the deserts of So-
nora, down the Sierra Madre range
to Jalisco. Arispe, the old capital
of the royal provinces of Sonora and
Sinaloa in the time of Philip III of
Spain, was the northern center of
the industry, and the region pro-
duced one-fifth of the riches that
found their way to Spain.
