## BRANDING NEW-DEAL MEASURES AS EXPERIMENTS AND FAILURES

There is much disagreement as to the purely experimental uses of taxpayers' money and as to methods used by the government in trying to eliminate poverty and provide security for old age, and, in trying to solve the problems of productive and lasting employment with non-productive and temporary employment. It just has to be taken for granted that future similar efforts to solve our problems will result in failure as in the past. Even the most ardent supporters of the present administration will have to admit, that from a financial standpoint, it has been a complete failure.

Too often those in power prate about the welfare of the ill-fed, and ill-clad, but seem chiefly concerned with their own welfare and political power. Under the present system the standards of living has been greatly reduced, not raised, as in all countries where governments have become all-powerful and dictatorial. We cannot afford to have our government to cost us as much as it does; its service in the various pump-priming experiments is not worth the cost. What the government should furnish is the opportunity for people to live their own lives in their rightful independence. The door to opportunity and happiness is plain work at adequate pay. The profit motive is universal—not confined to the rich or well-to-do. Wealthy and poor rise and fall alike in any nation. To be constructive let our government devote a little effort toward helping people to help themselves so that they can live in freedom and independence and continually raise their standards of living. . . . Our industries must strive if men are to work and live as citizens desire to live, and if buying power is built up, which would be the result of improved industrial possibilities, business would be good. . . . There is no other way to bring this nation back into prosperity, so let's build up the purchasing power of the masses.

### Guernseys are Sold To Tigard Men

Peterborough, N. H., June 3—A purebred Guernsey bull, Wandamere Della's Chief 257920 and a purebred Guernsey cow Wandamere Sunflower's Princess 539704 were sold recently by M. C. Fleming of Troutdale, Oregon to William Robinson of Tigard, Oregon, according to the American Guernsey Cattle club Peterborough New Hampshire.

Dr. W. A. Fishburn of Tigard, also purchased a purebred Guernsey cow, through the club.

### Unemployment Compensation Explanations given

Age or need does not enter into payment of unemployment compensation benefits. They are paid as a matter of right to eligible unemployed workers, each of whom should have ONE social security account number, regardless of age.

Eighty-five hundred Oregon employers contributed \$1,834,757 to the fund during the first quarter of 1938. Deductions from wages under the Social Security act are for old age insurance, ONLY. Employee contributions for unemployment compensation is prohibited by law.

Oregon's unemployment compensation benefit fund totals approximately \$5,000,000.

Oregon workers who for any reason have obtained more than one social security account number should take immediate steps to cancel all but ONE.

Food was purchased with one-third of the first \$3,000,000 paid to Oregon's unemployed workers under the state unemployment compensation law.

Credentials are furnished all accredited representatives of the state unemployment compensation commission.
