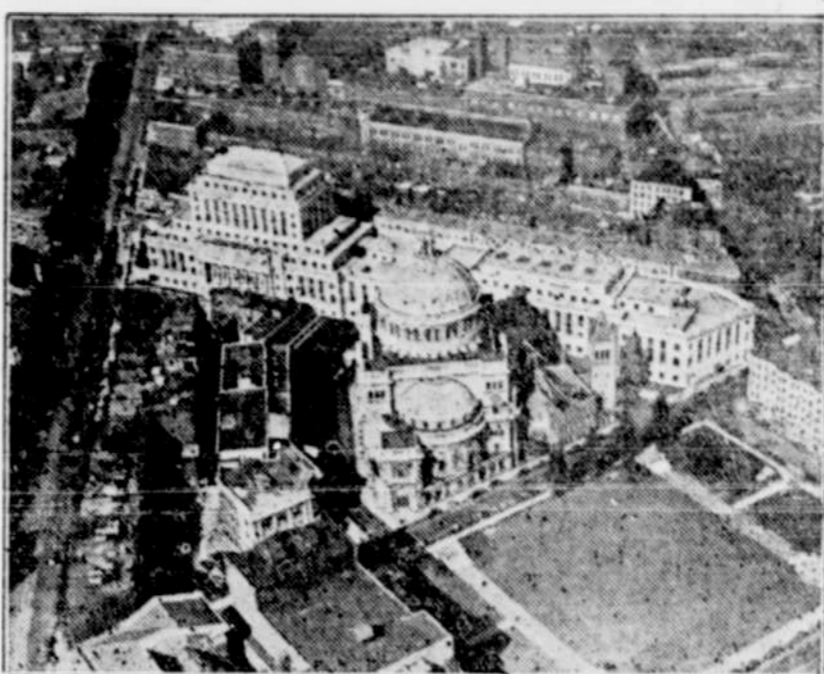

Boston Mass., June 6—A warning to nations "whose governments have been conceived largely in selfish ambition and brought forth by human force" was issued here today at the Annual Meeting of The First Church of Christ, Scientist. The Mother Church, by The Christian Science Board of Directors who declared the lessons of history show such governing bodies to be "of few days and full of trouble."

Reports disclosed continued growth of the Christian Science movement, increasingly higher standards for authorized periodicals, and a larger number of requests from groups of non-Scientists for representative Christian Scientists to address them. Election of Ralph Hastings Knapp, C. S., of Needham, Mass., as President of The Mother Church was announced.

He succeeds Judge Clifford P. Smith of Newton, Mass., Edward L. Ripley of Brookline and Ezra W. Palmer of Marshfield were re-elected Treasurer and Clerk of the Church respectively. The President is elected by The Christian Science Board of Directors to serve for one year. His duty is to be presiding officer at the Annual Meeting.

Directors Report

Mr. Palmer, reading the statement from the Directors, reported that The Mother Church has grown substantially in numbers during the past year; is united, harmonious, and without debt. Then continuing on the theme of world relations he read, in part:

"More important than all, however, is the marked success with which the healing ministry of Christian Science is being practiced throughout the world. It also indicates that the day is approaching when responsible heads of governments will see that undue reliance upon material means and methods to accomplish their ends inevitably results in failure and defeat. They will then realize that no nation is stronger than the moral fibre of its people, and that nation can become truly great and permanently endure only to the extent that spiritual qualities are cultivated in the thoughts of its citizens and permitted freely to operate in the government of their lives."

The Directors further called the attention of Christian Scientists to the responsibility they have in respect to upholding such fundamental issues of life as cultivation of good will and preservation of a system of government protecting the civil rights of its people and ensuring to them freedom of speech, of the press, and of religious worship.

"While we should not magnify error or become unduly alarmed by the present-day suggestions of war and through many channels," it was declared, "we must be keenly alert not to allow a false sense of security to lull us to sleep and make us indifferent to situations of national and international character which, unless corrected, are destined to affect our interests as directly as if the scene of their action were within the bounds of our own community."

The report of The Christian Science Board of Lecturers read by Richard J. Davis, Chairman, told of 3211 lectures delivered during the past year

Never Two Alike

Snowflakes fall by uncountable, unimaginable billions, in every snowstorm that blows. Sometimes they are big and moist, sometimes little and hard and dry. Second Largest Lake

For its altitude, Lake Tahoe in California, is the second largest lake in the world—only surpassed by Titicaca in the South American Andes. Twenty-two miles long by 12 miles wide, more than a mile above sea level in the tall Sierra, its depth in at least one part is more than 1,600 feet. Yet it isn't size alone for which Tahoe is noted. It is the combination of royal blue water and deep green pine, and the startling climb of frosty peaks, jumping to a quick 9,000 feet to inclose the lake on all sides.

London First Introduced

Fingerprints in Trials "for the first time in history," as important evidence in a murder trial at the Old Bailey—London's famous criminal court—in May, 1905. Scotland Yard had been experimenting for ten years with them and had some 80,000 fingerprints in their files, but never before had this "new peril to law-breakers" (as it was referred to in the newspapers) been used in a murder trial.

The accused were two brothers named Stratton. They were charged with the murder of an old couple. One of the brothers had left a thumb-print on a cash box. When the prosecution announced that the police were going to try to convict on that evidence, "there was a thrill round the court"—to quote the authors of "King's Counsel: The Life of Sir Henry Curtis-Bennett." Curtis-Bennett, then a young lawyer, appeared for one of the brothers.

The judge did not take to the fingerprint system wholeheartedly, and seemed to want murderers in the future to use ink when they left their impressions on cash boxes.

"When proper impressions are taken, the system is extremely reliable," he instructed the jury; "but it is a different thing to apply it to a casual mark made through the perspiration of a thumb. The evidence is not so satisfactory as if, for instance, the murderer had taken some ink and made a definite impression. But to a certain extent, the evidence is corroborative. The jury will not like to act on this evidence alone."

The brothers were hanged.
