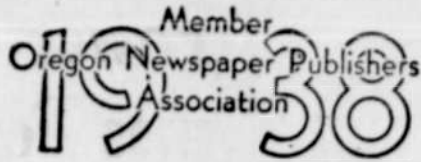

money. Is it right to use these funds, as gifts for the building of municipal plants which will destroy the existing private systems, financed by your hospitals, schools, churches, banks, insurance companies, and individual citizens?

These new public systems will help neither taxpayer nor customer. Their rates will be lower than private rates just as your living expenses would be lower if the government gave you your house and did not ask you to pay taxes. The municipality, however, will lose a tremendous chunk of tax revenues because private utilities are great taxpayers. The loss will be made up by higher taxes on homes and other real estate. In addition, some year soon federal taxes will be boosted again so that the federal government can pay back the money it borrowed to build these unnecessary power systems.

How did Your Congressman Vote? Furthermore, these new plants will not help to prime the prosperity pump. They will only frighten those who, in normal times, invest nearly a billion dollars annually in the building of needed new private power-plants. The government cannot prime the prosperity pump forever, especially if the priming never takes—and it will not take unless private capital begins to flow through the pump! A proposed amendment to the \$4,000,000,000 spending bill would have prohibited the use of PWA money as gifts for building competing power systems. The Congressmen and Senators who voted against this amendment should be shown their mistake.

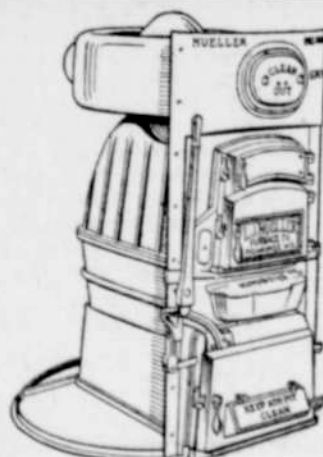
