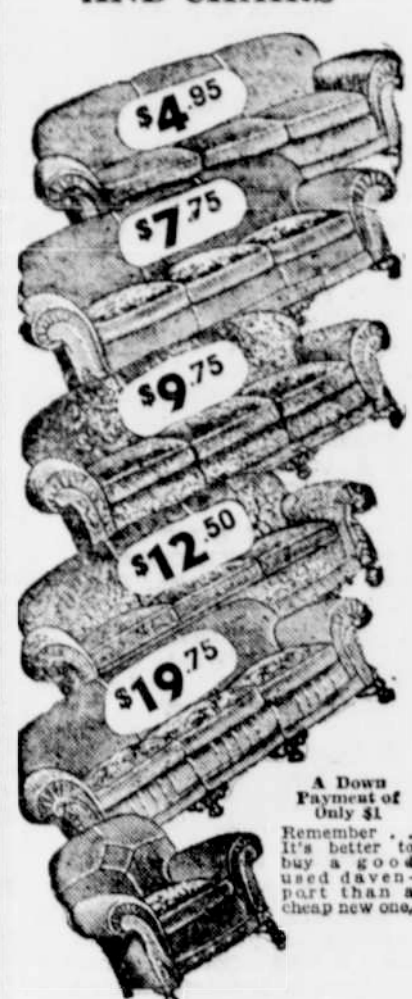

Our apples are getting flavorless and will not keep as they used to do; our pears are getting smaller and knottier each year; our berry fields produce less than one-half the old time yield; our wheat fields are producing less and less each year and the straws are getting too weak to hold up the heads; the alfalfa yield is falling fast.

Even nut trees are producing more blanks each year. The reason, lack of minerals in the soil.

The Germans tried manures, chemicals and so forth until they were getting only 10 to 12 bushels of grain to the acre of soft wheat. Now they grind schling from the smelters and rocks from the mountains with the result that this same land is producing 35 to 40 bushels to the acre of hard wheat. England went through the same experience and today is following Germany's example.

of your community.
The biggest hope that steamships have against air competition is their vacation appeal. Millions of people feel that a ten day or two weeks' cruise is the best relaxation possible. Hence, those who have the leisure will continue to prefer to cross the ocean by boat, but the steamships will lose much lucrative business. The maritime labor problem is still bad too, although it is better than a year ago. At that time the situation was impossible, but Joseph Kennedy's Maritime Commission smoothed it out to a considerable extent.

Own Some Aviation Stocks
For many years I have not cared for securities of shipping companies. I prefer to hold the securities of industries that have a great future. That is why I believe that everyone should own some aviation securities. The industry has tremendous possibilities. It is in that stage of the industrial life cycle where the maximum risk is gone, but the maximum growth still lies ahead. Stocks of many other industries are also attractive now because of the bright business outlook.

When I sailed to England a year ago, business was just starting its tailspin. It hit the ground with a bump and a lot of people were hurt. The situation today is exactly the reverse. The low in business was reached on June 8. Since then there has been an increase of 11 per cent as far as the United States is concerned. Moreover, war scares, hurricanes, and the like have not yet halted the sharp upswing. On the day I sailed business was at a new peak for 1938 and still rising. Now, what about conditions in Europe?

European Business Poorer?
I fear that while business has been improving in the United States, it has been falling off in Europe, particularly in Great Britain. My boat reaches England on Tuesday. From London, I go to Holland, Belgium, Germany and France. In the next three weeks, I will tell you what I find in these countries for I know that everyone is vitally interested in the outlook for war or peace.
