USEFUL HINTS

Expert Tells How To Cook Asparagus

Steam Heads in Double Boiler Until Tender

ASPARAGUS, like other vege-
tables, should be cooked just
long enough to be tender. It prob-
ably demands more care than any
other vegetable on this count both
because over cooking will cause the
tender heads to break and because
the stalks will be injured. As the
stalks are less tender than the
heads, they will need a longer cook-
ing. This may be accomplished in
a regular asparagus boiler or by
manufacturing one of your own,
through the use of two portions of
the double boiler. The stalks, after
the tough ends have been removed,
and the heads have been carefully
washed in running water to remove
sand, should be tied together in bun-
dles. These should be placed in the
water in the lower part of the dou-
ble boiler and covered with the in-
verted top of the boiler. The heads
will then cook in the steam, while
the stalks cook in the water.

Some sort of a sauce is always
used with asparagus. This may be
merely melted butter, which may
be flavored if you like with lemon
juice or combined with brown
crumbs. Sometimes grated cheese
is sprinkled over the asparagus be-
fore the butter is poured over it.
And then there is our favorite Hol-
landaise sauce which seems to have
been designed for asparagus. I like
even better a more delicate sauce
which for lack of better name I call
special. When this vegetable is
used as a main luncheon course you
may like to cover the drained aspa-
ragus which has been placed in a
shallow casserole with a good
cheese sauce and allow it to brown
under the broiling flame or in a hot
oven.

And don't forget that the discarded
ends of the stalks may be cooked
in water and then pressed through
a sieve to form a basis of a deli-
cious soup. I like to add a few
slices of onion and to flavor the
creamy soup with a bit of nutmeg
as well as salt and pepper. A little
whipped cream flavored with
minced parsley will add a final
touch of flavor.

Cream of Asparagus Soup.
3 tablespoons butter
1 tablespoon minced onion
3 tablespoons flour
1 teaspoon salt
Pepper
3 cups milk
1 1/2 cups strained, cooked aspara-
gus
Nutmeg
Whipped cream
Minced parsley
Melt butter, add onion and cook
one minute. Stir in flour and sea-
sonings and add milk gradually.
Cook five minutes, stirring until
thickened and smooth. Add aspara-
gus. Reheat, sprinkle with nutmeg
and serve garnished with whipped
cream flavored with minced pars-
ley.

Asparagus au Gratin.
1 bunch cooked asparagus
3 cups rich white sauce
3/4 cup grated cheese
Paprika
Arrange drained asparagus in a
shallow baking dish. To the white
sauce add half of the cheese, pour
over the asparagus and cover with
the remaining cheese. Sprinkle with
paprika and bake in a hot oven (500
degrees Fahrenheit) about 10 min-
utes, until cheese is melted.

Asparagus Salad.
1 bunch cold cooked asparagus
1 hard cooked egg white, chopped
1 tablespoon mixed pickle
1/2 tablespoon minced parsley
1 1/2 tablespoons minced pimiento
French dressing
Lettuce
Pile asparagus on large salad
plate. Add egg white, pickle, pars-
ley and pimiento to French dress-
ing, shake well and pour over aspa-
ragus. Garnish with crisp lettuce.

Hollandaise Sauce.
1/2 cup butter
2 egg yolks
1 tablespoon lemon juice
Cayenne
Divide the butter into two por-
tions. Put one portion in a sauce
pan with the egg yolks and lemon
juice. Cook over hot—not boiling—
water, stirring constantly until but-
ter melts. Add remaining butter
and cook until thick. Season. Serve
at once.

Special Sauce.
2 egg yolks
3/4 cup sweet or sour cream
1 tablespoon tarragon vinegar
Salt, paprika
Beat egg yolks slightly, add other
ingredients and stir over hot water
until sauce begins to thicken. Re-
move from heat. Serve with boiled
fish, cauliflower, broccoli or aspara-
gus.

Mushroom Sauce.
3 tablespoons butter
1/4 cup sliced mushrooms
1 teaspoon minced onion
2 tablespoons flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
Pepper
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup mushroom stock
Melt butter, cook mushrooms and
onion in butter five minutes. Stir
in the flour and seasonings and
when well blended stir in the milk.
Stir over fire until smooth, add the
mushroom stock (made by cooking
mushroom stems in water) and con-
tinue stirring until smooth and
thick. Let boil one minute.

Every time I discuss public spend-
ing I receive a flood of mail from
people who accuse me of being in-
human. They tell me we will have
revolution if we do not take care of
the 10,000,000 unemployed. I realize
that these millions of unfortunates
must be aided, although I totally dis-
agree with my critics as to how they
honestly can best be aided. However,
of our huge \$9,000,000,000 federal ex-
penditures this year, only 25 per cent
will go for relief of the unemployed.
The balance is being spent for grow-
ing permanent bureaus, the army and
navy farm relief, and pegging prices
of commodities such as silver and
cotton.

Silver Purchase

Take the silver purchase program,
for instance. The U. S. Treasury has
bought nearly \$1,000,000,000 worth of
silver from all over the world in
the last six years. We have almost
singlehandedly financed the Mexican
government by our silver purchases.
Our thanks for doing so was the steal-
ing of our oil properties by that gov-
ernment. We have accumulated a
mountain of silver bullion at a cost
which is nearly 3 times its commercial
value. And the sum total of our ef-
forts to make silver a monetary unit
again has been to destroy, perhaps
forever, its monetary character in ev-
ery country where six years ago it was
parts of the currency.

There are other examples of the dis-
astrous results of our government's
meddling with natural economic laws.
These various projects have cost
the nation billions of dollars
which must be paid for in higher
taxes for years to come. Furthermore
the cost of these disastrous experi-
ments will not be paid by the Rocke-
fellers, by General Motors, by prosper-
ous and growing concerns such as
those of my Illinois correspondent.
They will be paid by the small and
struggling employers, by harassed
white-collar people through hundreds
of hidden taxes on the necessities of
life.

Inflation Drawing Nearer

Unless the American people wake up
some day soon and change their char-
acter and goals, I do not believe that
spending can ever be controlled under
our present democratic form of gov-
ernment. Two years ago inflation
was in the headlines. Everyone was
talking about it, talking about it,
hedging against it. From a news-
angle, however it is now as dead as
the proverbial door-nail. But infla-
tion is far nearer now than it was
two years ago. When it will strike
no one knows. My advice to readers
is: Remember that the United States
and the whole world is rushing pell-
mell toward inflation!
