Life of Lumber Increased 3 to 5 Times by "Wolmanizing" Process

For centuries men have built houses, barns, fences, bridges, culverts, flumes, etc., only to have the sills, stringers, posts and sidewalls (any part close to the ground) rot away, or be eaten up by termites in a very short time.
