

Reedville School Began Before Oregon Was Admitted to Union

There's a good deal of history about the Reedville School, which would make up a good sized interesting book, but in a brief narrative it is well to say that the people of this vicinity had a deed to the school property just a few months before Oregon was declared a state of the union. The first school house was a one room affair and soon afterwards a two room structure took its place and the children from the area around which is now Aloha, came to that school and most of them were transported by team and wagon and whatever other vehicles could be provided, some boys riding horseback.

The old school house that was razed last year to make room for the fine new one, was erected in 1919. It is one of the best country schools in Washington county.

Mrs. Anna Langman, present clerk, has held the job over twenty years, now entering her 21st year. She was unanimously elected 21 times. The late Mr. Mellor had the clerkship just prior to the first term of Mrs. Langman. The late Dr. Peterson was for a time clerk of the district. A daughter of the late Dr. Peterson Mrs. Livengood lives in Aloha.

Charles Inlay is chairman of the board of directors, with Henry G. Hagg and Carl Trachsel. There are four teachers and last term 176 were in the school census and 112 children attended on an average.

The cost of the new building was about \$26,500 with PWA grant of 45 per cent.

George L. Germeyer of Tigard Electric has the contract to wire the new addition to the Forest Grove High school and also wire the new high grade school building at Gaston.

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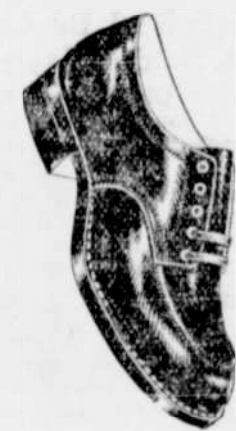
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
