Some 60 varieties of celery are
cultivated in the United States.

Turkey raising conditions were so
favorable in 1938 that a further ex-
pansion of production has been pre-
dicted for 1939.

Ten per cent of the total of eggs
produced in the United States in re-
cent years is estimated to have gone
into cold storage.

Gooseberries and currants are
hosts for blister rust, and for this
reason many states have passed
laws against their cultivation.

Commercial canners decided there
may be some merit in production
control since they went into the
present marketing season carrying
25,657,000 cases of the 1937 sweet
corn crop. They will try an experi-
ment this season to control the
amount of sweet corn to be canned.

More emphasis is being placed by
life insurance companies on the
making of farm mortgage loans
than for more than a decade, re-

Review.

houses are used to start early or

Farm economists are recom-
mending that farmers pay cash and

With other things equal, the larg-
er cows within a breed produce
more milk and make more profit
than smaller ones, according to an-
imal husbandry specialists.

Mechanical milk coolers are be-
coming popular on farms but the
dairymen should remember that low
temperatures only slow down the
growth of bacteria and do not re-
move them. Strict cleanliness in
handling milk should complement
cooling.

November Death Rate Decreases On Highways

Oregon's traffic death rate for the
month of November this year showed
a decrease of 24.3 percent from the
rate for the same month last year,
it was revealed today by Earl Snell,
secretary of state.

The rate this November was 14.9
persons killed per 100,000,000 miles
traveled, while the rate last Novem-
ber was 19.7. The improvement,
Snell said, was due to two things:
first, the reduction in the actual
number of persons killed this No-
vember compared to last November
and secondly, the sharp increase in
travel this year.

A total of 35 persons killed was the
toll for traffic this November as
against 39 for the corresponding
month last year. While deaths were
fewer, travel increased by 15.5 per
cent as shown by gasoline consump-
tion figures. This increase was one

of the greatest recorded for any one
month during the history of the
state, Snell declared.

Travel on Oregon highways and
streets during the month of Novem-
ber this year totaled 228,399,678
miles, on the basis of gasoline con-
sumed and figuring an average of 13
miles to the gallon. This figure
has been adopted as the standard
mileage rate by the National Safety
Council. Last November mileage
totaled 197,681,016 miles.

Oregon's death rate for the first
eleven months of this year was 11.2
as compared to a rate of 12.5 for
the same period last year. The death
rate for the state for the entire year
of 1938 was 12.7.

Oregon drivers are to be congratu-
lated on the showing made so far
this year," Snell declared. If this
record is sustained through the
month of December, the most danger-
ous month of the year so far as traf-
fic accidents are concerned, Oregon
can be justly proud of its record for
1939.

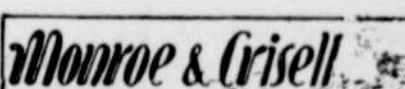
